Easter time - the great Sunday


We have just come to the end of the our first week of the Easter Season. It is important to remember that the celebration of Easter is prolonged throughout the Easter Season. The Church tells us that the fifty days from Easter Sunday to Pentecost Sunday are celebrated as one feast, the great Sunday.

At the Easter vigil last week, Ken and Peter were baptised, confirmed and received Jesus in Holy Communion for the first time. These three sacraments are known as the sacraments of initiation. Is that the end for them? Do we start planning for the next group of potential catechumens? Obviously not; it is only a beginning for them. For those who have been baptised it is suggested that they are part

of a period of post baptismal Catechesis or as it is sometimes called, mystagogia during the season of Easter. This is the time when the newly initiated experience being "fully a part of the Christian community by means of pertinent Catechesis and particularly by participation with all the faithful in the Sunday eucharistic celebration." It is a time to reflect on what has happened to them and it's implications for the life now.

This is true also for us who were baptised many years ago. As it says in the introduction to this period in the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults: "this is a time for the community and the neophytes together to grow in deepening their grasp of the paschal mystery and in making it part of their lives through meditation on the Gospel, sharing in the Eucharist, and doing works of charity." The new life of Easter needs to be assimilated and lived more faithfully by all of us.

We can do this by understanding Christ in the Scriptures and especially in the Gospels. Perhaps this is the ideal time to meditate on the Gospels during our daily prayer. Our children at Our Lady Immaculate are given each week a sheet entitled 'Wednesdays Word'. We hope that a similar but not so colourful sheet will be available every Sunday for you to take home so that we can ponder on next weeks Gospel.



I am writing this just before I set off to Lourdes, so the first sheet will not be available till next Sunday. Until then perhaps you could look at the Gospel for next Sunday, 22nd April, which is the third Sunday of Easter. It is Luke 24:35-48. In this Gospel we read how Jesus himself stood among the apostles in the upper room. Luke says that he opened their minds to understand the scriptures and he said to them repentance for the forgiveness of sins would be preached to all

nations in his name. Do I want to have my mind opened so that I can understand the scriptures? Here is a final quote to ponder as we immerse ourselves in the gospels this Easter time.

"The Easter stories are just as therapeutic as the many healing stories recorded in the Gospels. The way of resurrection is open to us not only during Eastertide, but throughout the year. In situations where we feel the fragility of life, when depression and hopelessness overwhelm us, when disappointment and resignation spread, meditation on the way of the resurrection can help us to reconnect with the life that overcomes death, that rises from the tomb, that thaws the frozenness and the inner rigidity which keeps us set in our ways, and leads us into sheer breath and freedom of the resurrection." CHILDREN'S LITURGY GROUP (SUNDAY 9AM MASS) CHANGES WITH EFFECT FROM SUNDAY 22 APRIL 2012

All children need to be registered before attendance. This is now required by the diocese – and most other local parishes already have a registration process in place.

Attendance only by children aged between 4 and 8 years (until children have taken their First Holy Communion). A large number of children attend the Childrens' Liturgy regularly and there is not enough space in the RDJ room and sacristy to accommodate parents and very small children. (If your child finds it hard to settle, we are happy for parents to accompany him / her initially, but if it seems that your child is not going to settle easily, ie after 2 or 3 attempts, it may be best to wait a few months and then try again). A Registration Form can be obtained from the RDJ room, the Parish Office in the Presbytery or the Parish website (www.olionline.co.uk). If you have not already done so, please return the completed form to the Parish Office ASAP.

From 22 April 2012, a register will be placed just inside the main entrance to the church before the 9am Mass on Sundays when the Children's Liturgy is being run. The register will contain a list of children for whom a Registration Form for attendance at the Children's Liturgy has been completed and returned. Before the Mass commences, a parent of a registered child should sign the box next to the child's name to indicate that they are attending the Children's Liturgy on that Sunday morning.

How to reach Non Churchgoing Catholics?

It is estimated that at least two thirds of the baptised Catholic community in England and Wales is non church going which equates to approximately four to five million people. This makes for a significant constituency of people who, in most cases, self-identify as Catholic but never or rarely attend Mass. Recently the Catholic Bishops Conference of England and Wales Department for Evangelisation Catechesis initiated a national project to support ministry to this group of people. Following the creation of a national core group and the putting on of a leaders day in London March 2011 five resource days for parishioners are now being offered across England and Wales. The latest is for the Westminster province and will take place at Parish Hall, Holy Apostles Church, 27 Cumberland Street, Pimlico, London SW1 4 LY on Saturday 28th April 10am-4.30pm.
