# Rite of Acceptance

I have heard many parents expressing their deep sadness and disappointment when their children happen to refuse to practice or believe in the faith they had passed on to them. They sometimes feel guilty and often blame themselves. They wonder whether they did not do enough or they did it in a wrong way. These

parents remind me of my mother, who was unhappy with me when I stopped being an altar boy after just a month. My younger brother was then an altar server and in a junior seminary. My mother would sometimes say to my brother; "Don't listen to your brother. He will lead you away from your vocation to the priesthood."

A couple of years later my brother was happily married with three children and I was a priest. She never fully understood what was going on in

my life and neither did I, until I started looking back. The fact is that my mother never stopped praying. I believe that her simple but strong faith in God and devotion to Our Lady, coupled with her kindness to everyone, became a source of inspiration when I had to make difficult decisions. In other words, she had planted seeds of faith in me even when I did not seem to accept or acknowledge it.

At the 6pm Mass on this Sixth Sunday of Easter, 40 young people from our Parish, will be celebrating the Rite of Acceptance. During the Mass, parents will light a candle for their child. First they will hold the candle together. The priest will ask the young people "are you ready to go forward to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation?"

Once the children have responded to the question, the priest will remind the parents that at their child's Baptism they agreed to carry the Light of Christ on behalf of their child. They will then be asked to let go of the candle as their

child takes more responsibility for her or his faith.

This wonderful and powerful rite of acceptance, asking the parents to let the candle go and be carried by their child, is a challenge to both the parents and their young person. It does not mean that the parents can now wash their hands out of the life of faith of their child. It

simply means that their role now is to support and encourage the young person to make the best decision on the path they want to follow. On the part of the children it is a sign of the increased responsibility given to them by us as a Church to keep the flame of Christ alight in the world.

On Saturday 26<sup>th</sup> May the Bishop will anoint the young people with the oil of Chrism, calling them by name and add the words; "... be sealed by the Gift of the Holy Spirit"

While the Sacrament of Confirmation is there to give more responsibility to them, the sad part is that many of the young people may feel that they do not need to practice thief faith anymore. Let's hope this will not be the case in our parish. The common excuse to this tendency is "Mass is boring!" This becomes a self-fulfilled prophecy by their own absence. Here at Our Lady Immaculate there are many opportunities for young people to get involved and make a difference. The Youth Group, the 9am Mass Sunday Choir, the readers and the altar servers are only a few of the possibilities open to them.

Like my mother, parents need to realise how much their perseverance in faith and good deeds impact on their children in the future, even when they may not seem to acknowledge it. Who knows, we may end up with priests and nuns among these children. Let us continue to pray for the parents and their children as we approach the day of Confirmation.
