A Miracle or Simply an Accidental Miss?

It is one of the most beautiful parts of the world, I have ever been to. Walking in the hot, narrow alley ways of the old town with its nice smell of spices like cloves, I fell in love with the place. People sat by specially made pavements playing games and whenever I asked for directions they were very polite and helpful.


My host received me with a big smile and welcomed me with a glass of cold beer, which tasted great. We discussed many social and development projects run by the Diocese in different parts of the island and the next day we visited water projects, a vocational training centre and a hospital. Since the island is predominantly

Islamic, almost all the beneficiaries of these projects are Muslims. Although they had very few Christians to whom they offered their "traditional" pastoral services, the nuns and priests were very happy with what they were doing. At the end of my visit I even felt a strong desire to commit my life to the island. This was twelve years ago in the island of Zanzibar.

On Christmas day last year I received a text message from a friend that Father Ambrose Mkenda was shot! I immediately recalled my experience with him as described above. He has worked in Zanzibar for over twenty years. As the vicar general and the financial secretary of the diocese, he was responsible for many development projects which served the poorest parts of the island.

He was on his way back from the Christmas Eve Mass in a neighbouring parish. Two gunmen on a motorcycle followed him closely. As he waited for the gate of his compound to be opened, one of the men shot him twice at point blank range. One bullet hit him just above the heart and the other dislodged under his chin. It is clear that the gunman aimed to kill. Doctors in Zanzibar acted fast to save his life and then he was moved to the Dar-es-Salaam for more surgery and further treatment. Thanks to the doctors and our prayers, his condition has been improving since then.

Although there is no clear evidence of who is re-



have been aware of the growing insecurity around him. But his dedication for the people of Zanzibar had remained strong.

There is a strong belief that it was simply a miracle that the bullets didn't kill Fr Mkenda. That God guided the bullets away from any major arteries. For a sceptic or cynic, this was simply an accidental miss. If God did intervene, why didn't he make the gunman miss altogether? I believe that God works in mysterious ways. Although he may not intervene in every incident, he does intervene in every aftermath. The peace and tranquillity experienced by many in Zanzibar will never be taken for granted any longer. It appears that human beings have to be provoked by evil incidents to awaken to the glorious presence of God's grace in our daily lives.

As we continue to pray for Fr Ambrose and the people of Zanzibar, let us thank God for every moment we experience of peace in our lives.

Ash Wednesday is the start of Lent when we are invited for forty days to set aside more time for prayer and fasting in preparation for Easter. The Ashes, made in the sign of the cross on our foreheads on this day, are an outward sign of our inward sorrow for

our sins and of our commitment to Jesus as Our Lord and Saviour.

From Ashes to Easter

This coming Wednesday we begin the Season of Lent. This is our preparation to celebrate Easter. Next Saturday those preparing for reception into the Church or baptism at the Easter Vigil will be going up to St George's Cathedral for the Rite of Election. This is when the Archbishop calls them to celebrate the sacraments at Easter. For all of us it is a time of prayer, fasting and almsgiving. You have plenty of opportunity for almsgiving by getting involved with various activities associated with the parish Lenten Project.

Regarding Prayer there will be Stations of the Cross after every morning Mass.
