

A dear friend of mine who died some years ago suffered from poor mental health. One evening I had to take her to the out-patients department of a local hospital that specialised in mental health. She was seen by a doctor while I waited. When she came out of the interview I asked her how did it go? "He asked me if I heard voices? I said YES. I hear you talking to me."

We often consider those who hear voices are perhaps suffering from some mental illness. Yet there are many voices calling to us today. The voice of the advertiser calling us to buy. The voice of the politician calling us to support their party, the voice of popular culture calling us to live and act in a certain way. The voice of our peers calling us to be one of the gang! Then there is the voice of Jesus. Can you hear him calling to you? "Come and follow me. Be my disciple." In the time of Jesus they didn't have sheep dogs to round up the sheep. The shepherd would have a unique call that when the sheep heard it they would follow him. The life of faith is our response to God's call to each of us. We need to treasure and nurture this life of faith. This will mean being attentive. It means listening when we ask "Lord what do you want me to do?" There is so much that can make us deaf to this



loving gentle voice calling out to us. We can be full of anxiety and worry. We can be caught up in our own concerns and needs that we hear nothing outside ourselves. We live our calling to be his disciples in different ways. Many of us live a single life filled with love and care for others, using our talents and gifts to serve

others. Others live a life of discipleship in married life. This is a unique path of loving and self sacrifice. There are those who choose to answer the voice of God calling them to be a disciple by living in a community of prayer and service as a religious.

Then there are those who God is calling today to be a disciple by sharing in the priesthood of Christ through ordination. This July I will have the joy of attending the ordination of a young man who comes from my last parish. He is in his twenties, studied law at university and went on to train for the priesthood. Please do remember him and the four other men who are being ordained for our diocese this year. They need our prayers and support in answering God's call to serve others as shepherds in this unique way.
