"Blessed are the Peacemakers, for they shall be called sons of God"

Last Sunday, during his Angelus address to the people gathered in St. Peter's square, Pope Francis called for a day of prayer and fasting for peace in Syria, in the Middle East and across the whole world, on Saturday 7th September (which, if you're reading this on Sunday, was yesterday). If you have missed this

day). If you have missed this day of prayer and fasting, it is possible to make up the day at another time, which I would recommend.

The Pope could have asked us to do many different things, he could have encouraged giving aid, he could have encouraged us to boycott Syrian products, or American products perhaps. The Pope has asked us, however, to pray and fast for peace. Let's look at how these spiritual weapons will help us to make peace.

"Injustice, excessive economic or social inequalities, envy, distrust and pride raging among men and nations constantly threaten peace and cause wars" says the Catechism of the Catholic Church (#2317). We may not have the power to affect the national and international manifestations of these sins, but we must recognise that we are all, to some extent, envious, distrustful and proud. We all have within us, in a small measure, the seeds of war, and so as long as these six elements exist there will be no true peace, but "everything done to over-

come these disorders contributes to building up peace and avoiding war".

Just as charity begins at home, so does the making of lasting peace. These six disorders need to be purified from our hearts, we need to have mastery over these disorders, as much as we are able. Fasting is one way to help us gain mastery over our instincts (#2043). By fasting we humble our

bodies, we recognise our need for bodily food, and as the body affects the soul, we recognise our need for spiritual food also. By fasting we suppress our own needs, so that we can become more empathic to the needs of others. By fasting we lose the distrac-

tions that cooking and eating provide for us, and give ourselves space and opportunity to allow God to approach us.

Prayer is a sublime union with God, we get to know him and we can ask things from him. God desires peace in the world, and so, by praying for peace we are uniting our desire to God's desire. We are made more and more holy by the act of prayer, but we can also ask God to influence our world. These are the twofold benefits of prayer.

So, the Pope has asked us to take up the two spiritual weapons of prayer and fasting. Then let us pray and fast for peace, and attempt each day to overcome injustice, inequality, envy, distrust and pride.

Dreams of the Beloved Community:

50th Anniversary of 'I have a Dream' speech by

Martin Luther King.

The 28th August 2013 marked the 50th anniversary of Dr Martin Luther King Junior's monumental 'I have a Dream' speech. The speech spoke about all God's people living in freedom and peace in a world governed by truth and justice. It called for liberty, equality and justice for all people, regardless of their racial heritage. Dr King's dream centred on a 'Beloved Community', a society built on justice, equality and freedom for all God's people which was rooted in scripture. particularly in Revelation 7:9-10. The speech remains an inspirational call for us to work for a fairer and more equitable world now. Few of us would consider ourselves to be racist, but racism will continue to exist unless we challenge it. The courage and commitment to justice, peace and non-violence in the Dream speech proved to be a critical and momentous tipping point for American civil rights. The speech has gone on to resound throughout the world and his a relevant message for us still.

Distribution of Funds to Charities adopted for 2013 Lenten Project

The Lenten Project Committee had previously decided that the end of June would be the cut-off date for the distribution of funds to the adopted charities. We are slightly later this year as we had to await receipt of the Just-giving money, which was donated for the sponsored walk, from the Archdiocese.

I am delighted to say that all monies have now been received and that the total amount collected was over £20,000! This is testament to the amazing generosity shown by OLI Parishioners, who have not only been generous financially but with their time too. There were over 20 events and activities which involved literally hundreds of people. The Tolworth Tornadoes hung up their bike clips this year as the main sponsored event was the Helen O'Brien Memorial Walk when Elaine and Fr Anthony led an intrepid group of walkers through the snow.

The Lenten Project Treasurer has this week distributed £5000 to each of the charities which the Committee had previously adopted. There is a small balance which is used to pay for the money transfers to the charities bank accounts and also to replenish the Lenten Boxes which are passed recycling. To remind you of the recipient charities:

Friends of the Holy Land: This project deals directly with 3 parishes in the Bethlehem area. The three Parish Priests meet to distribute food and clothing vouchers, blankets, heaters and medicines. The vouchers are "spent" at shops owned by local Christians. The Priests ensure that only the neediest receive support.

Emmanuel International: This project in Tanzania is providing expertise and engineers to provide a clean water supply to a Secondary School in Furahia. The local community provide the labour etc. At present their supply comes from a sand river bed some distance away and is both unsafe and unhygienic.

Asha Ashram: The CMI missionaries provide shelter for those physically and mentally challenged tribal people of the Jagdalpur area of Chattisgarh State in India who are often abandoned on the street. At the shelter they receive food, treatment, education & training.

Loreto Day School Calcutta: Sr Cyril, who founded the school, enlists the help of older children (aged 10 to 12 years) to scout their neighbourhoods and discover where younger children are working. These very young children are growing up in factories and shops deprived of the most basic rights of food, medical care and sleep. The owners are then persuaded to release the children for a few hours to attend the school to receive that care. The hope is that these children will gain some education/training to help themselves out of their predicament.



Priority: Pray for Syria

"This coming Saturday we will experience together a special day of fasting and prayer for pace in Syria, the Middle East", said Pope Francis at the end of the catechesis of last Sunday's general audience. "I renew my invitation to all the Church to live this day intensely, and from this moment on, express my gratitude to those brothers and sisters, Christians and of other religions, and to men and women of good will who wish to join. wherever they may be and in their own way, in this moment. I particularly urge the faithful and pilgrims in Rome to participate in the prayer vigil here in St Peter's Square at 7pm, to invoke from the Lord the gift of peace. Let us raise a cry for peace all over the world!" On Saturday evening after Mass here at Our Lady Immaculate we will be having exposition of the Blessed Sacrament for an Hour till 8.30pm. On the Sunday morning Mass at 9am the prayers will be from the Mass for the Preservation of justice and peace.

Pope Francis also said "With utmost firmness I condemn the use of chemical weapons: I tell you that those terrible images from recent days are burned into my mind and heart. There is a judgment of God and of history upon our actions which are inescapable! Never has the use of violence brought peace in its wake. War begets war, violence begets violence. With all my strength, I ask each party in this conflict to listen to the voice of their own conscience, not to close themselves in solely on their own interests, but rather to look at each other as brothers and decisively and courageously to follow the path of encounter and negotiation, and so overcome blind conflict."

The Triumph of the Holy Cross 14th September



Things must have looked pretty bleak to the apostles at Jesus' crucifixion. The cross must not have seemed a symbol of victory to them at this time, more a symbol of defeat. But with the Resurrection, the seeming failure of Jesus' crucifixion was no longer a failure but a triumph. Death no longer held the

same fear. Everywhere we look, the symbol of the Holy Cross is present to remind us of the infinite sacrifice that the Lord Jesus made for our redemption. The sign of the Cross is found in churches, schools, hospitals, cemeteries and even jewellery. The cross is a strong reminder to us that Jesus promises us that we too can share eternal life.
