The year with Gospel of Matthew has reached its end. Over the past twelve months, through this Gospel, we have been drawn into reflecting on the Kingdom of God and of course, the Kingship of Our Lord, Jesus Christ. The ending of the Church's year, on the feast of Christ the King is, therefore, an opportune time to recap on how the theme of this Kingship developed.

Jesus began his public ministry with this exhortation, "Repent, for the Kingdom of Heaven is close at hand". He then went about recruiting the nucleus of the community who would be the task force of the Kingdom - disciples, the Twelve.

In the Sermon on the Mount, Jesus proclaimed the ideals of the Kingdom, challenging the attitudes of the world around him. "How happy are the poor in spirit, theirs is the kingdom of heaven. Happy the gentle, they shall have the earth for their heritage" and so on. Indeed, challenging our world of today and into the future.

Jesus then turned to special training of the twelve apostles, repeatedly warning them there would be no half-hearted or easy way of following Him.

Their attention was then drawn to consider the Kingdom in the world around them. The Kingdom would necessarily have to grow in a world hostile to it and its ideals. However, the disciples were assured that it would prosper and grow, as wheat in the midst of darnel, weeds that looked like wheat. People would discover that it is a hidden treasure and worth paying a great price for.

Towards the latter chapters of the Gospel, attention is transferred back to all disciples

and Jesus trains this small community who will continue this work when He is gone. Despite Peter's protestations, Jesus must face Jerusalem where death and resurrection will be his inevitable destiny.

Over the course of seven Sundays, the disciples (and we) were given many lessons about how the community of the Kingdom should behave - about compassion, courage, faith, taking up the cross, dying to self, supporting the erring brother and offering forgiveness.

The final parts of the Gospel are located in Jerusalem. Jesus proclaims the ultimate vindication of the Kingdom. The harvest will see the separation of those who have their lamps ready from those who have not, and of those who use their talents profitably from those who did not. (Remember last Sunday's Gospel reading?)

And so we have reached today's Gospel on this last Sunday of the Church's year, when the values of the Kingdom of God are set out in stark detail and clarity. "For I was hungry and you gave me food. I was thirsty and you gave me drink. I was a stranger and you made me welcome; naked and you clothed me, sick and you visited me, in prison and you came to see me."

The Kingdom-of-Heaven-on-Earth means that our love of God is to be shown by attending to the daily, commonplace, nitty-gritty, needs of others, without thought of reward. The Kingdom of Heaven is close at hand just on the end of our arm!
