## Presentation of the Lord

Tomorrow in the Church's calendar of feasts (2<sup>nd</sup> February) we celebrate a fascinating feast day, the feast of the Presentation of the Lord.

We remember how the Holy Family, Jesus, Mary and Joseph, went up to the temple in Jerusalem to fulfil the laws of Moses. Mary had to offer a sacrifice as a sign that the period of her ritual purification after giving birth was over (Leviticus 12). Jesus, as Mary's first and only son, had to be redeemed (Exodus 13:12-15).

Forty days after his birth Jesus would have been 'presented', and so, forty days after Christmas we celebrate the Presentation of the Lord, finally closing the devotional Christmas season. In some places Christmas decorations will remain in place until this feast.

Now, it might be a temptation for us to think "ok, another event that happened to Jesus" and move on with our lives. But, that is a temptation that should be resisted, because the more we learn about the life of Jesus, the more we understand it's meaning, the more we understand the love God the Father has for us, and the projects and plans of love he has for us.

The rituals of the Presentation were simple ceremonies carried out in the Jerusalem temple, and we can imagine that the Holy Family were not there alone, but surrounded by other families with their first born, an waiting as part of an even bigger crowd of people waiting for the sacrifices to begin.

Now, we know more about this little family than those around them, than those who know them, and those waiting in the temple with them.

We know about the visit of the angel to Mary, we know about the dream of Joseph, and of course, we know about the true, divine nature of Jesus.

Some people might have pushed forward in line, drawn attention to themselves, made use of their blessing: "excuse me please, I'm the mother of God, please move out of the way". "Of course we should go first, don't you know whose Son I've fostered?"

Think about how many people use their wealth. Being ostentatious, flashy, attention seeking, but also desiring and able to avoid the difficulties of everyday life.

In our day that means having an expensive watch, a big car, a huge house, or any of the other luxuries that call attention to us and our wealth.

But, this little family, don't do that, they remain little, with the poor. Mary, Joseph and Jesus are hidden and quiet. Mary and Joseph wait like everyone else, and Jesus is presented just like everyone else.

In fact, it is their poverty, expressed in simplicity and hiddenness, which makes Mary, Joseph and Jesus very attractive to us.

Now, the Son of God has been born into a human family. But, we can continue to welcome him, every day, and every moment of the day.

These virtues of poverty and humility give us a way to welcome Christ. The proud have no need of Jesus, the rich have little space in their lives. But the poor and the humble, who come to the sanctuary of the Lord, amongst them, within them, the Lord Jesus can be found.

### **GM Babies**

The Government announced just before Christmas that it is shortly going to ask Parliament to legalise the production of human beings who, in order to eliminate some rare but very serious diseases, have had part of the ova (their mother's eggs) from which they themselves came replaced by material taken from other ova. These re-constructed ova would have then been fertilised artificially (i.e. by In vitro fertilisation – IVF). This process is known as mitochondrial donation, and would result in babies having, in effect, three parents. If the process is allowed it will for the first time allow the alteration of the DNA of future generations. It is essentially a form of genetic modification (GM), which was banned by Parliament in 2008. But in order to legalise it the Government is trying to redefine the process as genetic 'donation'. This would mean that the change in the law would not have to be debated by Parliament. Several prominent genetics experts have argued that the redefinition of GM is dishonest. They also warn it could undermine public trust in medical experts arguing for its introduction in the UK, the only country where it will be permitted in law if legislation is passed.

Apart from the serious damage that could be suffered by children produced by genetic manipulation, and on their descendants, this process is also objectionable because it ignores the possibility of curing or alleviating the serious diseases it pretends to target. Resources that could be spent on research into these diseases are instead being diverted into unnecessary and horrifying experimentation on human beings.
