Rejoice

The Third Sunday of Advent is known as Gaudete Sunday—'gaudete' being the Latin word for the command to Rejoice. We are nearing the culmination of the Season of Advent, our time of preparation for the celebration of the \birth of Our Lord Jesus.

What a pity it is when we hear this time of year is described as 'the run-up to Christmas'. The world around us is certainly moving expectantly towards a variety of climaxes, along a variety of paths of preparation, some of which anticipate the traditional celebration of Christmas Day itself.

When I hear what you and I know as Advent referred to as the run-up to Christmas, I feel a bit sad and disappointed, so it is uplifting to be reminded by the Church to rejoice, indeed to take heart.

One of the opening prayers at Mass this Sunbday expresses this sentiment thus: 'Father of Our Lord Jesus Christ, ever faithful to your promises and ever close to your Church: the earth rejoices in hope of the Saviour's coming and looks forward to his return at the end of time. Prepare our hearts and remove the sadness that hinders us from feeling the joy and hope which his presence will bestow, for he is Lord for ever and ever.'

As the second paragraph alludes to, we live in a very complex and fast moving society. It is very easy for us, if we are not careful, to lose our way amid the jungle of news and opinions with which we are constantly assailed.

The mass media can both enlighten and lead astray the human mind, so we need to be able to sift out the things that hinder us from feeling the joy and hope of the imminent coming of our Lord Jesus.

We cannot opt out of the world that we each have been born into. Indeed our Saviour chose to opt in to our world in the earthiness of a stable in Bethlehem. We seem always to live in troubled and worrisome times—for our world and for our Church, whose mission, nevertheless, is to be in the world and to be part of these troubled times but also to give us a foretaste of the Kingdom of Heaven in which we will share in the Heavenly Banquet.

The beautiful Season of Advent has a two fold character. It is a time of preparation for Christmas, when Christ's first coming is remembered and celebrated, and it is a time to direct mind and heart towards awaiting his second coming.

Advent, therefore is a time of devout and joyful celebration. We are blessed to be part of it. Let us not rush it but wait patiently—and Rejoice.
