My dear people

Season of Lent is almost over and I recall the prayer I shared with you at the beginning of Lent. "Dear God......be with me as I take another step in my Lenten journey....... begin with the sign of ashes on my forehead reminding me that this is no ordinary journey......and with your help I will new meaning in the Easter that awaits us all."

On this Palm Sunday, we hear these words at the beginning as the palms are blessed—"for five weeks of Lent we have been preparing, by works of charity and self sacrifice, for the celebration of our Lord's paschal mystery".

I do pray and hope that this Lenten journey you undertook on Ash Wednesday has helped you to walk with Christ our Lord and Saviour and experience the silent growth within you experiencing the love, the mercy and compassion of God.

In the first Gospel, we hear how Jesus sends two disciples to untie and bring a donkey no one has ever ridden, and, he tells them that if anyone asks what they were doing to say that the Master needs it and will return it. For me these are very powerful words and I believe we often miss the deeper significance of these words. We never loose what we give to God. God will always return them back to us!

We watch processions for coronations, triumphant welcomes we give to celebrities and heroes, and, perhaps join the crowds to experience the atmosphere. Imagine our hero, celebrity entering the city in ordinary clothes and riding a donkeyno decorations, no flags and no banners etc. If that was the case we, I am sure, will not give a second look! Jesus' leadership and kingship is not domination or authority but rather humility and service. This is what we hear in the second reading of the Mass from the Letter of St. Paul to Philippians.

It is difficult for us to understand and comprehend this idea. Holy Week in a way invites us to reflect on this paradox of the One who is all powerful and created the world, yet is in need and dependent! This is not new. We see this all through His life. But we forget and do not get the point. Jesus the divine teacher had to borrow the boat of fisherman to teach. He borrowed the bread and the fish from a young boy to feed the multitude. He had to borrow a cave to be born into this world and at the end had to borrow a tomb to be buried before rising from the dead. And today we hear how he had to borrow a donkey to enter into the city. Imagine it!!!

As we celebrate Palm Sunday and enter into this wonderful week-Holy Week- I like to place before you a simple thought. Will it be possible for Our Lord to borrow us-you and me-so that He could bring His love and His mercy, His compassion and forgiveness to our families, our communities and the world?

I wish you all a prayerful Holy Week.

Gospel John 20:1-9

Mary Magdalene, the first witness to the resurrection, found it hard to convince the apostles. It was only when Peter and John saw the empty tomb for themselves that they believed her words.

Baptisms in the Parish

Many parishioners want to know how to get their children Baptised in the parish. The practice in the parish is that all parents who want to have their children baptised are expected to follow the Baptism Preparation Sessions. These sessions are held on the First and Second Sunday of the month (except in the month of August) between 10.00am -11.00am in the Old Chapel (in April the preparations are on the 2nd & 3rd Sundays as Easter falls on the 1st Sunday of the month). Before following the preparation sessions please be good enough to speak to the priests and register for the sessions, so that the Catechists can be informed the names of those who are attending. Parents need to attend both sessions. Once they have completed the preparations, the parents can discuss the date of the baptism and fill in the Baptism Registration Forms.
