This coming Thursday 16th September Pope Benedict XVI lands in Scotland to begin his visit to the UK. Many people from the parish have signed up to go and take part in the Vigil at Hyde Park on Saturday evening and the Mass of Beatification at Cofton Park in Birmingham on Sunday morning. The rest of us, I am sure, will be following his journey on the television and radio. The Pope is also meeting

3,000 school children at St Mary's College, Twickenham on the Friday morning and celebrating Mass at Westminster Cathedral on Saturday morning after he has met the Prime Minister, the Deputy Prime Minister and leaders of the opposition.

The Queen as a head of State invited the pope to the UK, so he will be addressing representatives of British Society at Westminster hall. He will also be meeting the Archbishop of Canterbury and celebrating evening prayer with him at Westminster Ab-

bey. This will be a great four days for Catholics in the UK. Archbishop Vincent Nichols says "At the centre of all he (the Pope) says and does there is one unwavering conviction: that faith in God is not a problem to be solved but a gift to be discovered afresh". He also says that the Pope "is here to put before us the person of Jesus Christ the Redeemer who stands at the centre and purpose of all human history".

It is only to be expected that ahead of his visit there is opposition from certain groups and individuals. I was interested to read in an article by Fr Roderick Strange about Pope Benedict and Cardinal Newman in which he writes "And then Cardinal Newman referred to scandal: "No large body can be free from scandals from the misconduct of its members." As newspapers become more available," he re-

marked, "we are at the mercy of even one unworthy member or false brother." He anticipated a time of "darkness different in kind from any that has been before it," a time when people in Great Britain would no longer believe."

For our part we can give him our fullest support with our prayers, support him in what we say to others and support him by our presence. If you

Premier Radio plans to cover much of the visit. In London you can listen on 1305, 1332, 1413 MW and also it is on Dab Radio and Freeview and Sky. Our primary school, Our Lady Immaculate, is having a day of celebration on the Thurs-

day.

Finally, last Wednesday the Pope sent a message to us saying, "I am very much looking forward to my visit to the United Kingdom in a week's time and I send heartfelt greetings to all the people of Great Britain. I am aware that a vast amount of work has gone into the preparations for the visit, not only by the Catholic community but by the Government, the local authorities in Scotland, London and Birmingham, the communications media and the security services, and I want to say how much I appreciate the efforts that have been made to ensure that the various events planned will be truly joyful celebrations. Above all I thank the countless people who have been praying for the success of the visit and for a great outpouring of God's grace upon the Church and the people of your nation."


