REFLECTION FOR PENTECOST

THEME:

EMPOWERED FOR THE MISSION

Having completed his mission on earth, before Jesus Christ ascended to heaven, he promised his disciples the gift of the holy Spirit. This outpouring of the Holy Spirit, known as Pentecost, is what we celebrate today. Many see Pentecost as the birth of the Church since it was her first outing.

Pentecost Sunday is one of the most ancient feasts of the church, celebrated early enough to be mentioned in the Acts of the Apostles (20:16) and in St. Paul's letter to the Corinthians (16:8). It supplants the Jewish feast of Pentecost, which took place fifty days after the Passover and which celebrated the sealing of the Old covenant on mount Sinai.

At Pentecost, the Holy Spirit descended upon the Apostles and were granted gifts. The Church sees this event as the sacrament of confirmation. The Catechism of the Catholic Church says, "the imposition of hands is rightly recognized by the Catholic tradition as the origin of the sacrament of Confirmation, which in a certain way perpetuates the grace of Pentecost in the Church" (CCC. 1288). Pentecost therefore is a reminder of our personal reception of the Holy Spirit through the sacrament of confirmation.

This sacrament makes one soldier for Christ. The apostles lived in fear prior to Pentecost. On Holy Thursday, they fled from the garden of Gethsemane and abandoned Jesus. Though Peter had the courage to follow him from some distance, he later betrayed him by denying him. At Pentecost, having received the Holy Spirit, the apostles were bold to preach to the people and over 3000 people were converted.

We are reminded today by this celebration of Pentecost of the gift of the Holy Spirit infused in us when we received confirmation to help us live a christian life and to share this life of joy with others. St. Thomas Aquinas says, "the power of the Holy Spirit is not ours to wiled, as it is not a 'superpower' that we gain or an 'empowerment' that those who practice magic attempt to acquire for personal gain. Rather, we become candidates of grace, the Holy Spirit works through us to better our personal lives, to proclaim and live the gospel of Christ, and to help and inspire others with our teaching and example. In essence, we as believers become as the waters of Baptism and as the oil of confirmation through which the Holy Spirit ministers and bestows Grace to others.

Pope Francis, in his 2013 address to Italian young people said, "what is this sacrament called? confirmation... No! its name has changed; the 'sacrament of farewell' ". It bids us to manifest the fruits of the Holy Spirit- wisdom, understanding, knowledge, fortitude, piety, counsel and fear of the Lord. Also, to be dispensers of the gifts of the Holy Spirit- charity, Joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, generosity, gentleness, faithfulness, modesty and self control. Let's ask for God's grace to be at the service of this sacrament.
