

The Parish Lenten Project has been running successfully for 46 years. The aim of the Project is give the parish a charitable focal point during Lent and give everyone (all groups, clubs and societies) in the parish the opportunity to take part in fund raising for projects in the developing world.

The Lenten Project AGM will be held on Sunday 26th November 2017 at 7.30pm in the Old Chapel. At that meeting we will select the charities which we will be supporting during Lent 2018. We are now actively seeking parishioners to nominate suitable charities.

CRITERIA FOR SELECTING A CHARITY:

- 1. Charity or organisation needs to be based in the developing world
- 2. Direct help we looking for small charities/organisations rather than large established charities no intermediate organisations or government agencies
- 3. Christian based
- 4. Confidence in the recipient we need to know that the money will be going directly to the charity
- 5. Value for money small and professionally run charity/organisation in the third world
- 6. Organisations that have small overheads we want to make sure that our money will make a real difference
- 7. Only one charity will be supported per country per year

Only four charities will be supported per year

<u>Diocesan Safeguarding Training and Information</u> <u>Day</u>

As mentioned in the Newsletter last week, the Diocese is holding this day at Our Lady Immaculate Church so that everyone can access the latest information and advice in regard to a number of areas to do with Safeguarding. Only this week there have been a number of articles in the Press to do with the rapid rise in Internet abuse especially amongst Children and Young People. All schools are aware and take appropriate steps to reduce the instances but most take place out of school hours and, indeed, in the home setting. The training sets out to help parents and others recognise if this is happening to those they know.

Pope Francis set up a group some time ago to advise and tackle the problem of Human Trafficking and Modern Slavery. It is known as the Santa Marta Group and Fr Mark Odion recently spoke at all Masses about this

Group. (santamartagroup.com OR modernslaveryhelpline.org) Again, this is not something happening elsewhere but could be within our own community. Training will help to identify those vulnerable groups so that assistance can be given.

We have an aging population and many people are becoming housebound. frail, and alone. Some rely on Carers who on the whole provide a good service. However, this group are vulnerable to financial exploitation, physical and other forms of abuse from those they are in contact with. The Training will address all the issues involved.

Training Days always sound tedious but the information shared during these sessions on Safeguarding in the Diocese are useful and are a vital part of the process of ensuring that the Catholic Church fulfils its obligation to protect the Vulnerable in our society.

NOVEMBER - Month of All Souls

All Saints

On Wednesday we celebrate the Solemnity of All Saints, remembering all the saints known and unknown to us who enjoy the glory of heaven. In Gospel account we will hear the Beatitudes, which are guidelines for true joy and the attainment of sanctity in our Christian lives. We hear how to live lives of holiness so that we may attain happiness in this life, but even more happiness in the next life as we strive to likewise be numbered among all the saints in heaven.

All Souls' Day

All Souls' Day is unique on the liturgical calendar. Neither a solemnity nor a feast, this commemoration outranks other feasts and even takes the place of a Sunday in Ordinary Time (should this commemoration fall on a Sunday). Prayer for the dead reaches deep into our human history, and it has been our custom from the earliest days of the Church. The belief that our prayers can be of assistance to the dead is a treasured tenet of our Catholic faith. We profess it every time we recite the Nicene Creed: "I look forward to the resurrection of the dead / and the life of the world to come." (LTP Sourcebook 2017)
