Last Sunday, we reached the end of the Year of Luke (Year C in the three-yearly cycle of readings). As always, we honoured Christ the King, the Saviour who came to live amongst us, sharing in our humanity that we might come to share in his divinity. He shared fully in our humanity by dying for us, so that we might have 'life to the full', in the company of his

Father in Heaven. This was an Act of Love, without any limits.

This Sunday we enter the Year of Matthew (Year A in the cycle) and begin with the season of Advent. The world around us often refers to this period as the 'run up to Christmas', but we must see it as much, much more than that. The Season of Advent will focus our attention on the idea of the coming of God to us. In the end, Advent will lead us into the celebration of

the historical event of the coming of God to us at Christmas.

The Gospel readings from Matthew will draw our attention to John the Baptist, whose mission was to prepare the way for Jesus, our Saviour, and how that led him to be imprisoned. John was at pains to tell his listeners that he was not the Saviour, only the one who was preparing the way.

However, on this first Sunday our attention is drawn to the final coming of God at the end of time. Indeed, the Gospel is quite frightening, with references to Noah and the Flood, with people going about their everyday activities, they who 'suspected nothing till the Flood came and swept all away'. Jesus goes on

to say that 'it will be like this when the Son of Man comes'. Gloomy stuff, indeed! Just recently, in Cornwall, many unfortunate people there know only too well how lives can be transformed from one day to the next by the onset of floods.

So, it must seem odd that the Church's year should

start with a Gospel reading about the end of time. The images set before us are not meant to terrify us, but to remind us that we must not settle for being in our comfort zones but to stay awake, so that we may be ready when the Son of Man comes. Advent is a time of preparation, a time when we remember who it is who is coming. The challenge for us Christians is to do this remembering in the midst of our daily activities- at work, in our families, striving to keep our heads above water in a difficult and

changing world. This is the Flood \underline{we} have to contend with in our times. We cannot, and should not, neglect our everyday responsibilities, but let us take responsibility for remembering who it is who is coming, and why we are celebrating that. One of the opening prayers from Mass this Sunday will guide us.

Let us pray- that we may take Christ's coming seriously.

All-powerful God, increase our strength of will for doing good, that Christ may find an eager welcome at his coming, and call us to his side in the Kingdom of Heaven. We ask this through Christ, your Son. Amen.
