

#### **Towards a Culture of Safeguarding**

The Archdiocese of Southwark is committed to the safety and welfare of children and vulnerable adults. The Diocese co-operates fully with <u>CSAS</u>, the Catholic Safeguarding Advisory Service, which aims to help the Church become an example of best practice in the Safeguarding of children and vulnerable adults, and develop a "culture of vigilance" to ensure that children and vulnerable adults in our care are kept safe from harm.

#### ON LINE TRAINING

The Church has a responsibility to ensure all those who undertake work in the name of the Church are adequately trained in safeguarding matters. The Catholic Church is dependent on Clergy, Religious and Lay people using their skills and talents to nurture and support the Catholic community. Some will be paid employees, but the majority undertake their work on a voluntary basis. Whilst some will recognise their role as a volunteer, many rightly see their caring and support contribution as par their Christian responsibility and ministry. But we all have a role to play it safeguarding the young or adults who may be at risk and it is for this reason that the Catholic Church in England and Wales has worked with EduCare to bring you an e-learning package that will raise awareness throughout the Catholic Community in our countries. # ACTUAL EXAMPLE OF MISUSE FROM A PRIMARY SCHOOL LAST MONTH

Child discloses to teacher that she is upset because of conversation on Whats App

Teacher finds out that child was told on Whats App that their father committed suicide after raping her mother.

Head Teacher (DCP Officer) investigates and views Whats App conversation on child's phone. (Educ Inspection act 20066/07

The Whats App chat involved a number of year 5 & 6 students and included clips of hard core pornography.

Head Teacher calls in Police who asks parents of the children to attend a meeting

Parents shocked by the content but also their children's vulnerability and exposure to content so young

#### What is Group Chat?

The Group Chat feature lets you chat with up to 100 people at once. It is a great way to stay in touch with your family, friends and colleagues. In addition to the maximum number of people you can add to a group, there are a few more things to keep in mind about Group Chat:

- There is no limit to the number of groups you can create.
- Every group has one or more admins. Only admins can add or remove participants.
- Only admins can make other participants admins
- If the last admin leaves the group, a new admin will be randomly assigned.
- You can always control your own participation in a Group Chat, by staying in or leaving the group when you wish. Remember that only group admins have the ability to add participants. If you have any questions about being added to a group, or prefer not to be added, please speak to a group admin.
- If you have blocked a contact, you will still receive messages this contact sends into any group you have in sommon. Likewise, they will still receive messages you send to those groups.



22% of yp aged 11-18 report having been cyber bullied.



#### **OFFLINE**

Home is safe

**Often Physical** 

One or two people

See the effect on the person

**People watching intervene** 

Often silent



Can be all the time

**Usually words/pictures** 

Many people involved

Don't see effect on the person (lack of empathy)

**People watching take part** 

Can leave a trail (don't delete evidence)

# How does bullying feel for a child?

#### **SCARED & AFRAID**

Of being physically or emotionally harmed and that they might make it worse!

# t they might make it They may think a

They may think of themselves as failures and not worthy of being helped.

#### **EXCLUDED**

The peer group is everything! Especially online.

#### **INTIMIDATED**

Of further repercussions as bully may have threatened, "if you tell..."



#### **ANXIOUS**

That their parents and teachers might blame them for not standing up for themselves.

#### **GUILT**

They may feel it is their fault

And other feelings too!

# OF THE 1,984 PEOPLE CHARGED AFTER RIOTS:

- > 53% were under 20 years old
- **→ 42% received free school meals**

(16% nat. average)

▶ 66% of them had some specialeducation needs (21% of all pupils)
