THE TRINITY IS OUR MODEL & ULTIMATE GOAL
Pope Francis – Homily on Trinity Sunday, 21 May 2015

[T]he feast of the Most Holy Trinity...reminds us of the mystery of one God in three Persons: the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit. The Trinity is the *communion of Divine Persons* who are *one with the others, one for the others, one in the others*: this communion is the life of God, the mystery of the love of the Living God.

Jesus revealed this mystery to us. He spoke to us of God as the Father; He spoke to us of the Spirit; and He spoke to us of Himself as the Son of God. Thus, He revealed this mystery to us. After He rose, He sent the disciples to evangelize the peoples, He told them to baptize them "in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit" (Mt 28, 19). This command is entrusted by Christ in all ages to the Church, which has inherited the missionary mandate from the Apostles. He also directs it to each one of us who, through the power of Baptism, are part of his Community.

Therefore, today's liturgical solemnity, while making us contemplate the amazing mystery from which we come and toward which we are going, renews for us the mission of living in communion with God and living in communion among ourselves on the model of the divine communion. We are called to live not as one without the others, above or against the others, but one with the others, for the others, and in the others. This means to accept and witness in harmony the beauty of the Gospel; experiencing love for one another and for all, sharing joy and suffering, learning to ask and grant forgiveness, appreciating various charisms under the guidance of Pastors. In a word, we have been entrusted with the task of edifying ecclesial communities which increasingly become families, capable of reflecting the splendour of the Trinity and evangelizing not only with words but with the power of the love of God that lives within us.

The Trinity, as I said, is also the ultimate goal toward which our earthly pilgrimage is directed. The journey of Christian life is indeed essentially a "Trinitarian" journey: The Holy Spirit guides us to full knowledge of Christ's teachings, and also reminds us what Jesus taught us. Jesus, in turn, came into the world to make the Father known to us, to guide us to Him, to reconcile us with Him.

Everything in Christian life revolves around the mystery of the Trinity and is fulfilled according to this infinite mystery. Therefore, we seek to always hold high the "tone" of our life, remembering what goal, what glory we exist for, work for, struggle for, suffer for; and what immense reward we are called to. This mystery embraces our entire life and our entire Christian being. We remember it, for example, each time we make the sign of the Cross: in the name of the Father, of the Son and of the Holy Spirit

Glory be to the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit: As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, world without end. Amen

| FORMATION OF PARISH PASTORAL COUNCIL (PPC) | |

| <p>I want to thank all parishioners who have offered suggestions and ideas about the proposed Parish Pastoral Council (PPC), especially after my brief note in last week's newsletter. I understand, many would like me to offer a bit more information on the nature of the proposed PPC. I am happy to oblige as follows, albeit still rather schematic.</p> <p>Essentially, the PPC would support the Parish Priest in the pastoral leadership of the parish, in "fostering pastoral activity" (C.536, §1). Concretely, the PPC would, in collaboration with the PP, prayerfully discern what the Holy Spirit might be calling the parish to be or become. It would also provide a platform for organising the active participation and cooperation of the laity for the common good and mission of the parish; facilitates shared practical wisdom in response to the needs of individuals and groups in the parish and the parish's engagements in the wider community; facilitates short-term and long-term parish plans, and helps to ensure their timely and efficient implementation.</p> <p>In the light of the above, it would meet bi-monthly to discuss items concerning the parish, its environment, and its buildings, where practical solutions need to be sought. It may be necessary at times to form sub committees which members would serve on, along with others who would be co-opted to assist with particular projects.</p> <p>If you feel called by the Lord to devote a bit more of your time and talents to the service of the parish and community as stated above, please kindly put your name forward for consideration as a member of the PPC by end of Sunday, 16 June.
