#### **COVID-19 PRAYER INTENTION OF THE WEEK**

That, as we celebrate *Laudato Si'* Week during this pandemic, we may remember that "the cry of the earth and the cry of the poor cannot continue" (Pope Francis).

#### I WILL NOT LEAVE YOU ORPHANS

My dear sisters and brothers, we are fast approaching the end of Easter. In a couple of days from today (Thursday, to be precise) we will be celebrating the solemnity of the Ascension of the Lord, and nine days after that, the feast of Pentecost and the end of Eastertide. The scriptural readings of the sixth Sunday of Easter, therefore, rightly direct our thoughts toward the Holy Spirit and its influence, power and action in and through the apostles and first disciples.

Within his farewell discourse, Jesus promises to the disciples the abiding presence of the Holy Spirit. "I shall ask the Father," he reassures them, "and he will give you another Advocate, to be with you for ever." This is important because Jesus would be taken away from them through his death, but he would resurrect and then ascend to heaven, to return at the end of time. The time between his death and resurrection and between his ascension and second coming (Parousia in Greek) in particular, will be a time of witnessing to him, a time of propagating his message to people everywhere. It will also be a time of great testing, trials, tribulations, persecutions, etc. Either way, they would need support, since their master would no longer be with hem physically. That is why Jesus describes the Holy Spirit as another Advocate, a helper, a defender. Without the Holy Spirit, the apostles and their followers would be absolutely unable to witness to the Risen Christ or proclaim the Good News. The importance of the Holy Spirit in the life and mission of the disciples, and also in the Church today, is clearly underscored by the Ascending Lord as he says to the apostles: "but you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you, and then you will be my witnesses not only in Jerusalem but throughout Judaea and Samaria, and indeed to the ends of the earth" (Acts 1:8). The fulfilment of this promise is evident in the first and second readings.

The first reading (Acts 8:5-8) recounts the successful missionary outreach of Philip, one of the seven deacons (Acts 6:5-6) in Samaria, a Gentile territory north of Jerusalem. We may want to contrast the openness of the Samaritans to the Good News with the persecution that was unleased against the followers of Jesus by Jewish authorities after the gruesome martyrdom of Stephen (Acts 8:1b). The presence and power of the Holy Spirit is manifested through Philip's preaching and the miraculous healings and exorcisms that accompanied it. And this won many Samaritans over to the faith. The great joy that accompanied the conversion of the Samaritans is shared beyond their boundaries. Hence, the sending of Peter and John by the apostles to them to confirm them in the faith through the laying on of hands and impartation of the Holy Spirit (vv.14-16).

The Holy Spirit empowers believers to bear with whatever sufferings may come their way on account of their discipleship and mission (the  $2_{nd}$  reading). It guarantees the indwelling of God within them. That is why Peter admonishes them, "Reverence the Lord Christ in your hearts." He also enjoins them to be always ready to respond to those who ask them about the hope they have with courtesy, respect and a clear conscience. Of course, they could do none of these without the guidance of the Holy Spirit, the teacher, guide and counsellor par excellence.

May we be reassured, especially in this time of uncertainly, that we have not be left as orphans, because God has poured his love into our hearts though the Holy Spirit that we received both in Baptism and Confirmation. Let us, therefore, pray for a renewal of the gifts and fruits of the Holy Spirit in our lives and parish community. *IAE*
