LIGHTING UP THE WORLD

19 March 2023

We are coming closer to the celebration of the Easter festivities. Easter joy is anticipated provisionally on this fourth Sunday of Lent, which is also called *Laetare Sunday*. The name is derived from the opening words of the Entrance Antiphon of the Mass: "Rejoice, Jerusalem [Lætáre, Ierúsalem], and all who love her. Be joyful, all who were in mourning; exult and be satisfied at her consoling breast" (cf. Is 66:10-11). Thus, we pray in the Collect (opening prayer), "that with prompt devotion and eager faith the Christian people may hasten toward the solemn celebrations to come."

Saving joy is a fruit of encounter with the Lord. Whoever encounters him or allows him/herself to be drawn into an encounter with him, is normally transformed from within. This is typified in the Gospel account of the healing of a blind man by Jesus (Jn 9:1-41).

Like last Sunday's encounter with the woman at the well (Jn 4:5-42), Jesus takes the lead here; he reaches out to the man who was born blind. Whereas his disciples are concerned about popular Jewish belief which linked serious ailments like blindness to sin (cf. Mt 9:1-6; Jn 5:14), Jesus is concerned with doing the will of the Father who sent him (Jn 6:37-40). Like in Luke 13:1-3a, he clearly rejects rabbinic debate on who sinned between the man and his parents: "Jesus answered, 'he was born blind so that the works of God might be displayed in him." Thus, in his response to human suffering, Jesus emphasises the power of God to transform difficult situations, "for nothing is impossible with God" (Lk 1:37).

On the face value, the means of accomplishing this miracle may appear weird. "He spat on the ground, made a paste with the spittle, put this over the eyes of the blind man, and said to him, 'Go and wash in the Pool of Siloam." Yet it is strikingly symbolic. First, the mud from the dust of the earth echoes the creation account in Genesis 2:6-7. Second, the washing in the water of Siloam, recalls the healing of the leprous Syrian military officer, Naaman after washing seven times at the Jordan per the instruction of the prophet Elisha (2 Kg 5:10,14). Combining these two biblical antecedents, the symbolic action and instruction of Jesus that bring about this miracle, symbolise the creative power of Jesus who, through his Paschal Mystery makes humanity a new creation, released from darkness to become, as Paul says in the second reading (Ep 5:8-14), "light in the Lord...children of light." This is brought about especially through the Sacrament of Holy Baptism. The blind man, therefore, represents the Christian people who by their baptism are constituted a new creation, illumined by Christ so that they are able to 'see' and progressively grow in confidence to confess and worship him who has revealed himself as 'the Son of Man,' the Light of the world.

The restoration of sight here transcends mere physical sight. As St Paul says, "We walk by faith, not by sight" (2 Co 5:7). In contrast, though gifted with physical sight, the Pharisees display a pernicious spiritual blindness fueled by their lack of openness to the presence and action of Jesus. Believers must guard against falling into similar intransigence. Symbolically, at baptism, after the anointing with Holy Chrism and clothing with the white garment, the newly baptised or in the case of infants, the parents and godparents, are given a candle lit from the Paschal Candle while the minister says, "Receive the light of Christ." And continues: "Parents and godparents, this light is entrusted to you to be kept burning brightly. This child of yours has been enlightened by Christ. He (she) is to walk always as a child of the light ..." This is our mission as Christ's missionary disciples.

Lent provides us a unique opportunity of intensifying our desire and effort to be constantly transformed by our encounter with Christ so that we may truly reflect his light to the world as St Paul says in the second reading, "anything exposed by the light will be illuminated and anything illuminated turns into light. ©IAE.
