DISCIPLESHIP AND MARTRYDOM

Following Jesus is a huge privilege and a blessing. As highlighted especially in last week's Gospel (Mt 9:36-10:8), by being called, chosen and sent, the missionary disciple is offered the opportunity to perpetuate Christ's words and works in the world. Carrying out this mission comes, however, at a great personal and social cost.

Characteristically, Jesus did not disguise the truth that discipleship is indeed a costly venture. "If anyone wants to be a follower of mine," he says, "let him renounce himself and take up his cross and follow me. Anyone who wants to save his life will lose it; but anyone who loses his life for my sake will find it" (Mt 16:24-25). Discipleship is, therefore, a call to and an expression of martyrdom, that is, giving up oneself - privileges, comfort, relationships, and ultimately life itself for the sake of the Gospel or for the course of righteousness and truth (see Mt 5:11). Again, Jesus is blunt about this: "Anyone who comes to me without hating father, mother, wife, children, brothers, sisters, yes and his own life too, cannot be my disciple. No one who does not carry his cross and come after me can be my disciple" (Lk 14:26-27). Obviously, the challenges, risks, dangers, threats, suffering, as well as persecution and death associated with discipleship do not have the final word. These pale in the light of the hope which is rooted in our trust in God's faithfulness and love, and the promise of "the glory which is destined to be disclosed for us" (Rm 8:18). Today's liturgy of the word offers us two important examples in this regard.

The prophet Jeremiah is defiant against his opponents in the first

reading (Jr 20:10-13). His situation is so perilous; he is abandoned even by his friends who try to discredit him. Why? Because he has refused to compromise. Because he speaks the inconvenient truth. Because he has no time for political correctness. He says it as it is or as he is being instructed by God. He is not interested in looking at the polls to gauge what to say or do. Still, as a human being, he is traumatised by their scheming and plots against him. So, he laments his ordeal in their hands. Nonetheless, he refuses to be intimidated by them. Convinced that evil does not and cannot have the last word, he turns to God for vindication and vengeance. Thus, he confesses his faith in him, saying: "But the Lord is at my side, a mighty hero ... for he has delivered the soul of the needy from the hands of evil men." In the Gospel (Mt 10:26-33), Jesus admonishes his disciples to be defiant in proclaiming the Good News, openly and clearly, without any equivocation. Pre-empting the resistance that this would occasion, he advises them not to be afraid of persecution and martyrdom. "Do not be afraid of those who kill the body but cannot kill the soul; fear him rather who can destroy both body and soul in hell." True discipleship always presents us with a real choice: disown Jesus and 'live' (be included, accepted, rewarded, or celebrated), or profess him (stand up to his teaching and values) and face certain 'death' - literally or figuratively (cajoled, excluded, scorned, browbeaten, etc.). In the face of these mortal threats, the true disciple is encouraged and challenged not to be afraid, to remain faithful, not just like Jeremiah but ultimately like Jesus himself "who for the joy that was set before him endured the cross, despising the shame, and is seated at the right hand of the throne of God" (Hb 12:2). Every generation and Christian have received the mandate to confess the name of Jesus, to proclaim the Good News and propagate the values of his Kingdom, welcome or unwelcomed (2 Tm 4:1-5; cf.1 Co 9:16). Like our forebears, we are challenged to remain steadfast and courageous in the face of those who resent the Gospel today. We must resist, for example, the lure to capitulate to the rampaging forces of secularisation and relativism that are eating deep into the roots and fabric of the true Christian values that originally underlaid our society and its foundational ethos. We can do this if we dare to

imitate Jesus and, like him, are ready to let go of ourselves. ©IAE NEXT SUNDAY'S READINGS
