SHARED PRAYER OF THE WEEK

Grant me, O Lord, good digestion, and also something to digest. Grant me a healthy body, and the necessary good humour to maintain it. Grant me a simple soul that knows to treasure all that is good and that doesn't frighten easily at the sight of evil, but rather finds the means to put things back in their place. Give me a soul that knows not boredom, grumblings, sighs and laments, nor excess of stress, because of that obstructing thing called "I." Grant me, O Lord, a sense of good humour. Allow me the grace to be able to take a joke to discover in life a bit of joy, and to be able to share it with others (*St Thomas More*).

CALLED, CHOSEN, AND SENT

We return today to the Sundays of the Ordinary Time, that is, after two intervening Sundays following the wondrous feast of Pentecost, during which we celebrated the solemnities of the Most Holy Trinity and the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, respectively. Through the Ordinary Time of the liturgical year, the Church is invited to ongoing conversion by striving to live the life of Christ in response his call. Consequently, there is nothing 'ordinary' about this longest period of the liturgical year. Indeed, if anything, the Ordinary Time is an extraordinary period of growth and maturation.

During this time the Church is invited and challenged to interiorise the mysteries of Christ and, thereby, allow them, by the help of the Holy Spirit, to permeate deeply the lives and activities of its members and institutions and, indeed, the whole of history in view of their full accomplishment in Christ, "the Alpha and Omega, the Beginning and the End" (Rev 1:8; 22:13) at the fullness of time when "God shall become all in all" (1 Co 15:28). It is, therefore, no coincidence that today's liturgy of the word focuses our attention on our vocation and our identity and mission as God's holy people, called, chosen, and sent out to witness to his presence and action in the world.

Our calling is prefigured in the calling of the disciples in the Gospel (Mt 9:36-10:8) which is, in turn, foreshadowed in God's call and choice of the people of Israel in the first reading (Ex 19:2-6). Now, God's covenant with the people of Israel is set against the background of his revelation of himself to them as a loving and caring Father who is sensitive to and personally touched the plight of his suffering people (Ex 3:1-4:17), his deliverance of them from slavery in Egypt (Ex 12:31-42; 13:17-14:31), and the manifestation of his glory (shekinah) to them (Ex 16:4-12; 24:16-18; 33:18,22; 40:34).

Similarly, Jesus' choice of twelve of his disciples whom he sends out (hence the name, apostles) "with authority over unclean spirits with power to cast them out and to cure all kinds of diseases and sickness," mirrors the twelve tribes of Israel. The symbolism of their number reflects the fact that they are constituted as the core of the new people of God. Strikingly, like with the people of Israel, the missioning of the twelve disciples is set against the background of Jesus' expression of his empathy and compassion for the people. His intervention and action are motivated, sustained, and accomplished purely from the point of view of their suffering and needs. The evangelist Matthew leaves us without any doubt in this regard. "When Jesus saw the crowds," he states, "he felt sorry for them because they were harassed and dejected, like sheep without a shepherd." This sets the stage for the sending of the disciples since, as he stresses, "the harvest is rich but the labourers are few." Their mission was not about merely performing miracles - "Cure the sick, raise the dead, cleanse the lepers, cast out devils" but, above all, to "proclaim that the kingdom of heaven is close at hand." Jesus' words and deeds remain the example and precedent for the apostles; like him, their missionary mandate is to be exercised without any selfish motive, handing on freely what they had received freely (cf. 1 Pt 5:2).

Through holy Baptism (and Confirmation), we are constituted into a priestly (and kingly) people, a consecrated nation. By the anointing of the Holy Spirit, we are called, chosen, and sent as missionary disciples to bring the Good News of salvation to people near and far. This is an unmerited honour and privilege. To paraphrase St Paul in the second reading (Rm 5:6-11), the same "Christ [who] died for us while we were still sinners," is the One who has entrusted to us the task of extending his mission in the world as his missionary disciples despite our failures. And so, we rely on his help as we reflect on what it means for each of us and for all of us as a community, the Church, to be called, chosen, and sent to announce God's Kingdom. ©/AE
