## SHARED PRAYER OF THE WEEK

#### PRAYER BEFORE READING THE HOLY BIBLE

Father, anoint me with your Holy Spirit, so that as I read your eternal word, your word may penetrate my whole being and transform me.

Grant me the blessing to be a faithful disciple in believing the Word of God and that I may be a light shining upon all who are in darkness. Amen.

#### **EXPERIENCING THE POWER IN GOD'S WORD**

Among the Ibibio people of the Niger Delta region of Nigeria where I was born and had my early upbringing, the spoken word is very important. Words are generally believed to bring about what they express. Hence, good parents / grandparents are always careful with what they say to their children / grandchildren, especially when they are not happy about something or their behaviours. In the same vein, the blessing of a parent / grandparent is highly priced and coveted while a curse by them is scary. In other words, for the Ibibio people, words are fundamentally performative; they have consequences.

A similar worldview is revealed in the Hebrew tradition, both in the Old and New Testaments. The prophet Isaiah expresses this powerfully in the first reading (Is 55:10-11). Just as the rains and snow do not fall to the earth without tangible impact, the Lord says, "so the word that goes from my mouth does not return to me empty, without carrying out my will and succeeding in what it was sent to do." This is demonstrated in the creation narrative in Genesis 1: "And God said, 'Let there be... and there was ..." (see Jn 1:3). Likewise, the Roman centurion said to Jesus, "Only say the word and my servant will be healed" (Mt 8:8). Notably, God's word is creative because it is not only an extension of God's being and power but, ultimately, as the fourth gospel asserts, God himself: "In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God" (Jn 1:1). The interior capacity of God's word is underlined here. Once uttered it is unfettered. It just acts. Automatically!

Now, in relation to human beings, God's word (indeed, God himself) is always susceptible to rejection and / or outright opposition. The story of the fall of the first man and woman (Gen 3) and the experiences of the prophets and apostles (see Jr 20:7-8; Ez 2:2-7; Am 7:10-15; Acts 4:13-20) are strong reminders to us that God's word does not function magically or in a deterministic manner as if human response to it is completely unnecessary. As God respects human freedom and places himself literally at our disposal, so does his word. This is revealed, above all, in the New Testament in the mystery of the incarnation. According to St John, the incarnate word was not recognised by the world which was made through him or accepted by his people to whom he came (Jn 1:9-11). Yet "to all who did accept him he gave power to become children of God" (Jn 1:12). This truth is echoed in Jesus' parable of the sower and the seed in

today's Gospel (Mt 13:1-23). Like the seed that is scattered on different soil types, the word of God requires appropriate conditions in the recipients to unleash its inner potentials. As Jesus explains, the four soil types correspond roughly with four spiritual dispositions. Understanding is fundamental to them. Its absence in the first three soils and presence in the fruitful soil is quite telling. As a gift of the Holy Spirit, it helps us to grasp the meaning of revealed truths which are known by faith. It assists us to appreciate and enjoy them in such a way that our faith ceases to be sterile and passive but fruitful and active, inspiring a newness of life modelled after our Lord. We grow in understanding of the faith especially through prayer and ongoing study / investigation. That is why it is not just enough to attend Mass on Sunday if we want to deepen our faith and commitment as disciples. We must create time for personal prayer, scripture reading, spiritual reading and, when possible, spiritual retreat. This way we would foster and sustain the second disposition, that is, deep rootedness in faith, which provides a buffer not only in moments of trials, temptations, or persecutions but also against the third barrier, namely, the worries and enticements of the world.

God is constantly sowing his word in our hearts particularly through the ministry of the Church. To experience its transforming power, we must be open to welcome it with faith, work hard to grow in its knowledge and practice by the grace of the Holy Spirit. ©*IAE*
