O Merciful Redeemer, and God of infinite patience, I am astonished and confounded at your unwearied patience, always waiting for us to turn back to you. Help me to imitate you and grant me an increase in patience and conformity to your blessed will in all the adversities of this life.

Strengthen my weakness, confirm this my resolution of patiently waiting for all things. Amen

SAVED BY GOD'S PATIENCE

John the evangelist offers us a wonderful insight into God's being and action in the declaration: "God is love" (1 Jn 4:8b). This imagery is reflected in different ways in salvation history, that is, through creation, redemption, and sanctification. Imagining God as love, however, does not detract from God's omnipotence. Instead, it reinforces his supremacy and clarifies its nature as power to serve and save rather than dominate and destroy. God's power is, therefore, manifested above all in his unconditional love for all. And divine love is characterised, among others, by patience and kindness (1 Co 13:4). This truth is reflected in our liturgy of the word today.

The sage in the first reading (Ws 12:13,16-19) declares that God's sovereignty is a force for good. Though not permissive, God is not draconian in wielding his power: "Your justice has its source in strength, your sovereignty over all makes you lenient to all. You show your strength when your sovereign power is questioned and you expose the insolence of those who know it; but, disposing of such strength, you are mild in judgement, you govern us with great lenience, for you have only to will, and your power is there." The sacred author sets before us two lessons, namely, to be kind and forgiving to others and to be open to repentance / conversion.

Jesus echoes the sage in the three parables in the Gospel, particularly that of the wheat and the darnel (Mt 13:24-43). The patience of God is indeed legendary. Imagine the disappointment of the farmer on hearing that his labours have been infiltrated and potentially destroyed by an enemy. Yet he remains calm and reflective. He refuses to be stampeded into any hasty action or reaction. According to the evangelist, he is restrained to protect his crops: "because when you weed out the darnel you might pull up the wheat with it." Positively, it can also be seen as giving the good seed the chance to prove themselves, making sure they remain steadfast to end (see 2 Co 12:7^b-9^b), since the kingdom of God also requires effort and sacrifice (Ph 2:12). He trusts them! Of course, it is a risky thing to do because the darnel, like the thorns in last week's parable (Mt 13:7,22), can become very invasive and choke the wheat. But that is the depth of God's love and power. He respects our freedom, and, in the process, risks being rejected as exemplified in the fall (Gen 3) and our personal experiences of going astray. Still, he does not give up on us. He gives us opportunity to return, "the good hope that after sin you will grant repentance." This reality is mirrored, as expressed in Vatican II's Dogmatic Constitution on the Church, by "the Church, embracing in its bosom sinners, at the same time holy and always in need of being purified, always follows the way of penance and renewal" (Lumen gentium, §8).

Despite our weaknesses God trusts us, that we would be reasonable and allow his grace in us to bear fruit, just like the yeast in the dough or the mustard seed in the other two parables. As underlined in the three parables, God's patience is our saving opportunity (cf. 2 Pt 3:15). Likewise, we need to imbibe God's patience if we are to continue his work of salvation in the world. In this regard, Benedict XVI reminds us in his homily at the Mass for the inauguration of his Petrine Ministry in Rome on Sunday 24 April 2005: "It is not power, but love that redeems us! This is God's sign: he himself is love. How often we wish that God would make show himself stronger, that he would strike decisively, defeating evil and creating a better world. All ideologies of power justify themselves in exactly this way, they justify the destruction of whatever would stand in the way of progress and the liberation of humanity. We suffer on account of God's patience. And yet, we need his patience. God, who became a lamb, tells us that the world is saved by the Crucified One, not by those who crucified him. The world is redeemed by the patience of God. It is destroyed by the impatience of man." ©IAE
