FAITH BEYOND BORDERS

Faith has no borders. It is not limited to certain people, places, ages, or classes. Like goodness, kindness, truth, mercy, love and, indeed, virtues generally, faith can be found everywhere and in everyone provided the right conditions and/or opportunities or exposures are present. Sadly, oftentimes this is not always recognised due to ignorance and/or prejudice, thereby giving rise to discrimination. To overcome such negative stereotype, proper knowledge of 'others' especially through real encounter is very important. The prophet Isaiah, the apostle Paul, and particularly our Lord Jesus remind us of this truth in today's readings.

In the first reading (Is 56:1,6-7), the prophet (Third-Isaiah) announces a new and inclusive vision for the people of Israel after their return from exile in Babylon. No longer shall the people of God be limited to ethnic Jews. Foreigners too will be incorporated into it, provided they attach themselves to Yahweh "to serve him and to love his name and be his servants" by observing the sabbath and upholding his covenant. Integrated into the people of God, foreigners can now offer sacrifices in the Temple alongside native Jews thereby conferring a new identity on the sanctuary, "a house of prayer for all peoples" (see Mk 11:17). This shift was influenced partly by their exile experience of the goodness of some of their pagan contemporaries, but above all by the generosity of the Persian king Cyrus who liberated them from captivity and supported them to return to Jerusalem and rebuild the Temple (Ezra 1:1-11; see 2 Chr 36:23; cf. Is 45:1-6,13).

The apostle Paul in the second reading (Rm 11:13-15,29-32) contrasts the openness of the Gentiles to the Good News of Jesus Christ with the rebellion of the Jews. Though frustrated by their stubbornness, Paul sees their disobedience as a blessing to the Gentiles among whom he was proud to labour as an apostle. Yet, for him, God's promise to the people of Israel is not revoked by the admission of the Gentiles. On the contrary, he considers the salvation of the Gentiles as a challenge to the Jews.

The Canaanite woman is commended by Jesus for having great faith in the Gospel (Mt 15:21-28). Four qualities combine to make her faith great. The first is the audacity to reach out to Jesus for help: "Sir, Son of David, take pity on me. My daughter is tormented by a devil." She was clearly in breach of the racial and religious barriers that separated Jews from Gentiles, especially Canaanites who were mortal enemies of the Jews whom they had hated not only for displacing them from their land but also for considering them inferior (dogs!) to the Jews. Next, her perseverance. She was not ready to give up, even when Jesus ignored her. Though it is not clear if she was upset (who wouldn't?), she seemed calm and persisted even when he eventually responded dismissively. Third, humility. Undeterred, she approached him and knelt at his feet, begging him still. Lastly, her sense of humour. Rather than give way to anger in response to a patent racial insult by which Jews called Gentiles dogs, she creatively outwitted Jesus by reminding him that "even housedogs can eat the scraps that fall from their master's table." Thus, this complete outsider, through her great faith (boldness, perseverance, humility, and humour), did not just break racial and religious barriers; she challenged Jesus to do so too. Gladly, Jesus recognised her great faith and obliged her by granting her request. His praise of her is even more significant if we contrast it with the reprimand issued to Peter in last week's Gospel, "Man of little faith...why do you doubt?" Faith is essential to discipleship. Without faith we cannot follow Christ. Faith is a supernatural gift, infused by the Holy Spirit, gifted through Baptism, and strengthened by God's word, the sacraments, prayers, and good works. It may be at work through everyone, even from outside the community of believers. As Christ's disciples, we are

Anyone with a DBS clearance older than 3 years will be required to be re-checked under the new system. NB: The children will need to know simple prayers before they register. A prayer sheet is available for collection after Mass.
