BETWEEN PREACHERS AND MODELS

"Modern man listens more willingly to witnesses than to teachers, and if he does listen to teachers, it is because they are witnesses" (*Evangelii nuntiandi*, §41).

Preaching is at the heart of the Church's mission. This truth is underscored especially in Jesus' mandate to the twelve disciples, "And as you go, proclaim that the kingdom of Heaven is close at hand" (Mt 10:7). Faithful to the Lord's command, the apostles made it the centre of their ministry (see Acts 6:2). St Paul highlights the link between faith and preaching when he says, "faith comes from hearing, and that means hearing the word of Christ" (Rm 10:17). That is why he sees his ministry primarily as consisting in preaching Christ, especially to the Gentiles (1 Co 1:17). Considering it a binding obligation, the apostle is unafraid to assert, "Woe to me if I do not preach the gospel" (1 Co 9:16). Yet, for him, preaching is not merely about words or giving instructions. Above all, it is the witness of his life. So, he does not hesitate to set himself as a model for the faithful to follow: "For though you have countless guides in Christ, you do not have many fathers. For I became your father in Christ Jesus through the gospel I urge you, then, be imitators of me" (1 Co 4:15-16), "as I am of Christ" (1 Co 11:1).

Evidently, the apostle Paul is reiterated by the above words of Pope Paul VI. Addressed originally to a laity group in 1974, the pope's words capture the essence of Malachi's rebuke of Israel's priests in today's first reading (Mal 1:14-2:2,8-10) and Jesus' criticism of the scribes and Pharisees in the Gospel (Mt 23:1-12). The scribes and Pharisees are called out by Jesus for their hypocrisy, highhandedness, and pride: "You must therefore do what they tell you and listen to what they say; but do not be guided by what they do: since they do not practise what they preach. They tie up heavy burdens and lay them on men's shoulders, but will they lift a finger to move them? Not they! Everything they do is done to attract attention." These three ills resemble those that the prophet Malachi imputes to the priests: straying from God's way especially by partiality; causing scandal by their teaching; and destroying the covenant of Levi.

Now, as Catholics, when Jesus says that the scribes and Pharisees "occupy the chair of Moses," we may naturally be tempted to think about the hierarchy, that is, the pope and bishops. Afterall, they constitute the teaching authority of the Church (Vatican II, Lumen gentium, §25)! And the priests and deacons too. There are plenty reasons to justify such 'finger-pointing.' Nonetheless, the message of Jesus applies to all of us as people of God, the Church to whom the duty to proclaim the Gospel is variedly entrusted by virtue of our baptism (Lumen gentium, §35). In other words, as Christian disciples, we are reminded, individually and collectively, not just to avoid these three malaises but to counter them with obedience to the truth. recognition of our essential equality, and humility. For, indeed, we have one Father and were created by the same God. This truth must not just be affirmed and repeated as a creed. It must be applied concretely, especially in the manner that those in positions of authority carry themselves, relate to, and/or treat those under their care - in the family, Church, school, and wider society.

Finally, contrary to the bad example of the priests, the scribes, and Pharisees, Paul and his fellow workers in the second reading (1 Th 2:7-9,13), offer us strength and encouragement. Their exemplary witness gives us hope that we too can model our Creed / profession of faith, *"eager to hand over to you not only the Good News but our whole lives as well."* As Paul VI observes, "for the Church, the first means of evangelisation is the witness of an authentically Christian life, given over to God in a communion that nothing should destroy and at the same time given to one's neighbour with limitless zeal" (*Evangelii nuntiandi*, §41). @IAE
