# SHARED PRAYER OF THE WEEK

Dear heavenly Father, I thank you for your abundant generosity and for all the talents you have bestowed upon me. May I always use them in a way that honours you and brings glory to your name.

Help me to be a faithful steward of my time, talents, and resources, using them for the benefit of others and for the building up of your kingdom of justice and peace.

Guide me in recognising new talents within myself and grant me the wisdom and perseverance to develop them. Amen.

#### SHARING OUR TALENTS

Once upon a time, in rural South-South Nigeria, there lived two kids next to each other who were close friends, and regularly visited one another's house. One was generous and the other greedy and stingy. The generous one was always happy to share his food with his friend whenever he showed up as he often did at his mealtime. But the stingy one always made sure he had his meal before or after his friend had come and gone. Of course, his friend took no notice of this. Meanwhile, one day, his friend visited unannounced, just as he was about having his meal. Unfortunately, it was already too late for him to get up from the mat where he sat on the floor, to put the food safely away. Still, not wanting to share with his friend, he quickly shoved the plate under a nearby sofa and sat back, pretending to be arranging some cowrie shells on the mat as his friend came in. As usual, they spent a long time together chatting and playing games till late into the evening. Finally, his friend left, and he quickly dashed for his dinner under the sofa, only to find the plate empty. Some rodents had helped themselves to it! What a painful loss it was indeed because he was afraid to share with his friend.

The third servant in Jesus' parable of the talents in today's Gospel (Mt 25:14-30) is afflicted by the same malaise as the stingy kid in the above Ibibio folktale. He receives the master's talent and hides it away. His excuse is interesting: "I was afraid, and I went off and hid your talent in the ground." His fear of failure is reinforced by prejudice about the master-investor, "I had heard you were a hard man, reaping where you have not sown and gathering where you have not scattered." Overcome by negativity, he becomes blind to the opportunity offered by the talent given to him and, therefore, fails to see it as an expression of trust and a means of empowering himself. He is ungrateful. This, in turn, deepens his fear and suspicion of the master. His attitude radically contrasts with that of the first and second servants. They are grateful for the opportunity given to them. Besides, they understand that the master expects them to make returns for his investment and are not afraid to take risk towards achieving this goal. They echo the perfect wife whom the sage in the first reading (Pr 31:10-13,19-20,30-31) extols not just for being hardworking, reliable, resourceful and profitable to her husband, but also because "she holds out her hand to the poor, [and] opens her arms to the needy." Consequently, the author asserts "Give her a share in what her hands have worked for and let her works tell her praises at the city gates." Their attitude clearly mirrors the master's the initial risk taker who by his action also inspires them to follow suit.

The master typifies God while the servants represent his people. Like the master, God bestows gifts on each and all of us. So, we are all gifted. He entrusts different talents to us; hence, we are all talented. It does not matter what the gifts or talents are, whether they are extraordinary or ordinary, great or small, numerous or single. What matters is how we use them and / or what we make of them in God's service. Like the master, he takes a risk with us not just by entrusting his property to us but also by leaving it to our imagination and initiative how to make proper use of them. Since God did not spare his own Son (Rm 8:32), but risked Him for our sake, we too must be ready to risk all that we have and are if we are to be his true disciples. Through faith, hope and charity, we are empowered to trust God and to take the risk to make use of our gifts and talents in his service. Conversely, doubt, fear, and selfishness lure us to hoard or bury our talents, time, and resources; this, in turn, diminishes these gifts as well as ourselves and others. Particularly, as a Christian people, such attitude and outlook constitute a negation of true discipleship as a call and commitment to bear fruit (Jn 15:16) through the imitation of Christ in the service of God and others, especially the least of Christ's brothers and sisters - the poor, vulnerable, and outcast. @IAE
