RESPONDING TO GOD'S WORD

21 JANUARY 2024

Today is the Sunday of the Word of God, the fifth since it was introduced by Pope Francis through his Apostolic Letter, *Aperuit illis* (30 September 2019). By setting aside a particular Sunday in the liturgical year to focus principally on the Word of God, Pope Francis reiterates the teaching of the Second Vatican Council (1962-65) in its dogmatic constitution on Divine Revelation, about the place of Sacred Scriptures in the life of the Church: *"The Church has always venerated the divine Scriptures just as she venerates the body of the Lord, since, especially in the sacred liturgy, she unceasingly receives and offers to the faithful the bread of life from the table both of God's word and of Christ's body" (Dei verbum, §21).*

The Word of God is always at the centre of the Church's life, inspiring and energizing its mission: "For in the sacred books, the Father who is in heaven meets His children with great love and speaks with them; and the force and power in the word of God is so great that it stands as the support and energy of the Church, the strength of faith for her sons, the food of the soul, the pure and everlasting source of spiritual life" (lbid.). On this note, Pope Francis invites the Christian people on this Sunday, to strive to make God's word better known and extensively spread, to help the people of God "to grow in religious and intimate familiarity with the sacred Scriptures" (Aperuit illis, §15).

Encounter with the Word of God reminds us of an essential truth of God's interaction with humanity, namely, that the God who speaks to us through his sacred word – and fully and definitively through his Son, the word made flesh (Jn 1:1-8; see Hb 1:1) – also desires our response. That we listen and act! Opportunely, today's liturgy of the word, echoes this truth.

In the first reading, the prophet Jonah (3:1-5,10), after an initial resistance (Jo 1-2), surrenders to God's word and sets out straightaway to announce God's message to the people of Nineveh. Unlike the prophet, the people immediately welcome the word, renounce their sins, and embark on penance, from the greatest to the least, including domestic animals. As a result, "God relented" and spared them "the disaster which he had threatened." Similarly, the apostle Paul in the second reading (1 Co 7:29-31), underscores the urgency of responding to God's word. His call to the church in Corinth reiterates Jesus' first proclamation as recorded by the evangelist Mark in Gospel (1:14-20): "The time has come ... and the kingdom of God is close at hand. Repent, and believe the Good News."

It is striking that Mark situates the call of the first disciples within the context of this fundamental proclamation. Their response is equally notable. Instantly, leaving everything and everyone, they followed him. Theirs is a huge leap of faith. Like the Ninevites, their response is inspired, provoked, and fortified by their openness to his call. They accepted and surrendered to his word, allowing it to take flesh in their hearts, transform their lives, and reshape their vision and priorities. Though immediate, their response is not hasty but deeply considered and, consequently, introduces them into a lasting companionship with the Lord. Obviously, this resonates well with the theme of this year's Sunday of the Word of God: "Remain in my word" (Jn 8:31).

According to Archbishop Rino Fisichella, Pro-Prefect of the Dicastery for Evangelisation (Rome), Jesus' invitation which is expressed in this theme, is "not to scatter, but to 'remain in him' in a deep and radical unity like that of the branches to the vine (see Jn 15:1-7)." The fruitfulness of the disciples is deeply rooted in this profound intimacy with the God who, "in his great love speaks to humankind as friends" and "enters into their life (Bar 3,38), so as to invite and receive them into relationship with himself" (DV 2). To remain in his word implies being constantly open to listen to, embrace and cherish God's word by responding to it with faith, hope, and love. © IAE
