A COVENANTED PEOPLE

18 FEBRUARY 2024

The word 'Covenant,' occupies a prominent place in the Hebrew Scripture (the Old Testament) and in the New Testament. It frames God's relationship with humanity, represented especially by the call and election of the people of Israel as his chosen people. With them God set up a covenant. According to the Dogmatic Constitution on the Church of Vatican II, this was "done by way of preparation and as a figure of that new and perfect covenant, which was to be ratified in Christ, and of that fuller revelation which was to be given through the Word of God Himself made flesh" (Lumen gentium, §9).

The Christian people are given a share in this sacred bond through the sacraments of Christian initiation – Baptism, Confirmation, and Holy Eucharist. They are constituted into a covenanted people. This is underscored in the readings of the first Sunday of Lent (Year B).

In the first reading (Gn 9:8-15), the sacred writer highlights the saving and transforming power of God's covenant with Noah and his sons after the Flood. It created a new people and marked a new beginning. Clearly, the pact was not between equals. Neither was it jointly triggered. The initiative rested absolutely on God, the superior party. By his own free will and out of his love and mercy, he 'bound' himself to them and their descendants and every creature, promising never to destroy the world again by flood.

For Christians, the flood and the accompanying covenant foreshadow holy baptism and the new life of grace that emerges from it. The apostle Peter explains this in the second reading (1 Pe 3:18-22) when he asserts, "That water is a type of the baptism which saves you now, and which is not the washing off of physical dirt, but a pledge made to God from a good conscience, through the resurrection of Jesus Christ." Thus, at the blessing of the baptismal water at the Easter Vigil, the priest declares: "O God, who by the outpouring of the flood foreshadowed regeneration, so that from the mystery of one and the same element of water would come an end to vice and the beginning of virtue..." Through the liberating and transforming power of baptism, believers enter into a covenant relationship with God. They pledge to renounce Satan and all his works and empty show. Equally, they profess belief in the Holy Trinity, the holy Catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the dead, and life everlasting. Through these promises, they are linked spiritually to the everlasting covenant made by Christ with his blood (Lk 22:20). However, like the people of Israel after the covenant with Noah, our relationship with God is far from perfect. We are not always faithful to our baptismal promises. We often fall into temptation, turn our backs against God, and sin. Nonetheless, despite our unfaithfulness and sinfulness, God never revokes his promise (2 Tm 2:13). As the apostle explains, in the fullness of time he sent his only Son to lead us back to himself through his paschal mystery: "Christ himself, innocent though he was, had died once for sins, died for the guilty, to lead us to God."

Our covenant relationship with God is constantly sustained and renewed through ongoing conversion. It is nurtured by the Word of God, prayer, the sacraments, especially Confession and the Eucharist, and by charitable works. Lent offers us a unique opportunity to achieve this, individually and collectively. Like Jesus in the Gospel (Mk 1:12-15), during Lent, we are particularly invited to withdraw into the wilderness of our souls to rediscover our true selves, review and deepen our relationship with God and others and be equipped to resist temptation and evil. This will empower us, like Jesus, to witness to the presence and power of the Kingdom by our thoughts, words and actions. Jesus' first public proclamation – "The time has come ... and the kingdom of God is close at hand. Repent, and believe the Good News," requires immediate and honest response from all of us this Lent and always. © IAE
