THE HOUR HAS COME

In the first reading, the prophet Jeremiah explains the new covenant which God has promised. The second reading from the letter to the Hebrews explores the undeserved suffering of Jesus and the glory that his obedience brought. In the Gospel reading Jesus announces that his hour has come and explains his impending suffering and death to his disciples. The hour has come is one of the common themes in the Bible. Jesus constantly refers to this hour. In the Gospel of John Chapter 2, his mother went to Jesus in Cana of Galilee to say, 'they have no wine.' Jesus said to her, 'my hour has not yet come.' Several times he referred to the hour and said, 'my hour has not come' but, in today's Gospel he says 'my hour has come'. What is this hour? On the surface level, it was the hour of shame and failure, darkness and evil, the hour of defeat and humiliation of the cross. But, by the virtue of the resurrection and by the virtue of what St. Paul refers to as God's foolishness being greater than man's wisdom or God's weakness being greater than man's strength(1Cor1:1-25). The hour of Jesus' death has become his finest hour. Jesus' hour became the turning point of his ministry. The hour when Jesus was lifted up in disgrace is ironically the hour when he is lifted up in exaltation. This is the hour when the work of salvation is all accomplished. The hour of Jesus's humiliation has become the hour of victory. The victory of good over evil and the victory of God over hate. The hour of Jesus' humiliation has become the hour of divine mercy. At Gethsemane, Jesus prayed passionately, 'Father, if it is possible, let this cup pass over me.' The second reading in Hebrews 5:7-9 says that this prayer of Jesus was heard by God, yet Jesus was not spared from the physical death he prayed against, rather through obedience to the will of God, he achieved his ultimate destiny. From this point of view his prayer was heard. Jesus found fulfilment through obedience to the will of God. Friends like Peter wanted to dissuade him from going the way of the cross, but he scolded Peter sharply calling him Satan. Jesus knew that it is through obedience to his Father's will, whatever such will entail, that he will find ultimate fulfilment. Jesus came for the purpose of saving the world, and this purpose could only be achieved through the cross so he had to submit himself to the cross to fulfil his mission on earth. 'Unless a grain of wheat falls to the ground and dies, it remains a single grain.' In the face of tribulations, Jesus was confident that God would hear his prayer. The fundamental spirituality of Jesus was that unless a grain of wheat falls down and dies it remained a single grain, armed with this, Jesus made a self-sacrificing choice to do the will of God. He said, 'I laid down my life so that I will take it up again, no one can take it from me'. Jesus uses his Godly principles to decide. Now and again we are challenged to make the choices that could put our reputation, our relationship with friends and family and our financial security at risk. At such times, we must summon the courage to go the way shown to us by Jesus, recognising that our life meaning and fulfilment are found in the realisation of God's purpose. If our ultimate values are earthbound, then we could make decisions that ensure our material success and prosperity. Every critical decision we make in life have fundamental values. If our values are godly values, then our choices will be acceptable to God and in accordance with God's design for us even if they now and again result in suffering and pain.

LESSONS - 1. Life is fruitful only to the extent to which is laid out or given away. 2. A glorious life does not consist in the degree of our self-expression but in a degree of our self-sacrifice. What makes us rich is not what we keep for ourselves but what we give away. Only those who accept this logic can live true Christian and a fruitful life. It is in the surrender of Jesus' life that Jesus bore the seed of salvation.
