ANOTHER NAME FOR MERCY IS COMPASSION

07 APRIL 2024

Today is designated as Divine Mercy Sunday. It started when Pope John Paul II made the surprise declaration in his homily at the canonization of St. Faustina on April 30, 2000. He said "the Second Sunday of Easter, from now on, throughout the Church, will be called 'Divine Mercy Sunday."

Saint Faustina was an apostle of Divine Mercy. She was given three assignments by Jesus; firstly, to pray for souls and entrust them to God's incomprehensible Mercy; secondly, to proclaim to the world about God's generous Mercy; and thirdly, to start a new prayer movement focusing on Divine Mercy.

What is Mercy? Mercy can be illustrated with this story about French Emperor, Napoléon and a soldier's Mum. Once, a soldier was found guilty with a serious offence. The soldier's mother came to Napoleon and asked pardon for her son. Napoleon said that since it was the second major offence, justice demanded death. The mother implored, "I do not ask for justice, I plead for mercy." "But," said the emperor, "he does not deserve mercy." "Sir," cried the mother, "it would not be mercy if he deserved it, and mercy is all I ask for."

Mercy is derived from the Latin word "misericordia". It, in turn, derives from two words: misereri, meaning "to have pity on" or "compassion for" and cor, meaning "heart". Mercy, therefore, carries the idea of having compassion on someone with all of one's heart. Compassion is the most repeated attribute for God found in the Bible. Taken together, when we pray, 'Have mercy on me, God!', we are actually asking God to have compassion on us, or to hold us in His loving-kindness. And more intimately, we are asking Him to re-create or rejuvenate us in his presence.

Divine mercy Sunday reminds us strongly that God is a God of Mercy and that his mercies are unending, all-forgiving and total. The reality of Divine Mercy Sunday is actually the reality of our existence. We live, breathe, work, play and pray surrounded by a sea of Divine mercy and compassion. It is in his mercy that we experience the forgiveness that we need for our healing. It is when we experience this forgiveness, that the need to forgive others becomes clearer to us. There is no one that everexperienced mercy that will ever withhold it from another person. We must be cautious lest we withhold mercy from others. It's not hard to do. Our harsh judgements, anger, gossip, jealousy, and many other negative attitudes we often bring forth can push mercy out of the room. It's so easy to find ourselves talking about others, judging others, placing ourselves above others rather than showing them mercy.

The message of Divine Mercy is very important and urgently needed in our world today. If there is mercy, there would be no killing one another in wars and violence and the world would be a better place. We would live in peace with one another, wars would by and large cease to exist, families will not be estranged from each other, communities would not be fragmented, our planet would not be struggling for survival, sufferers from poverty would not have to wake up each day with despair in their hearts. If we truly understand Divine Mercy, we will be kind and caring to one another.
