Who are the Spiritans?

The "Spiritans" is the equivalent of "Holy Ghost Fathers," a Religious order, who for many generations have focused on the evangelization of the poor. They work among the poorest of the poor in society. You will see Spiritans in marginal communities such as refugee centers, slums, orphanages and working with street children. In the United Kingdom, the Spiritans are increasingly engaging in chaplaincies such as prisons, homeless projects, hospitals, detention centers and school chaplaincies because these groups, today, represent the new faces of the poor. The Spiritans are a missionary order often sent to places where the Gospel has not been heard or has scarcely been heard, and are working in more than 60 countries in the world. They are responsible for bringing the faith to many communities in Africa and the Caribbean. The African continent became the graveyard of many Spiritans, but they were unrelenting, they paid a high price to bring the faith to Africa. In the Caribbean, and North and South Americas, the Spiritans not only brought the faith but established many educational institutions that have empowered many generations of people. The Spiritans also promote Justice and peace for the oppressed and marginalised people as part of their mission. The Spiritans were founded as a religious order in France in 1703 on the feast of the Pentecost by a young man called Claude Poullart De Place, who came from a rich family but he gave up his wealth in order to be a member of this religious order dedicated to the poor.
