A Rich Man's Wealth is Measured at his Funeral

The world sees the self as the ultimate, and encourages us to put our wants and desires first. The self is exalted as the ultimate that needs to be pampered and treasured. However, Jesus reminds us to focus on God and others. Ironically, when we focus on God and others, the self grows stronger and more beautiful. Contrary, when we focus on ourselves, we lose God and we lose others and the self reduces. Consequently, when we lose God and others, we are dead. This reminds us that the true worth of life is not what the self owns but what is owed to the other. To look beyond the self is to have a greater and more life-giving perspective. This perspective reminds us that true greatness of life is not in possessions, but kindness. A proverb of my people affirms that the true measure of a man's riches is at a person's funeral, which is measured by the number of tears shed because of the way the deceased touched the lives of others. Offering someone your time, kindness and life is the measure of wealth and greatness. True leadership is found in becoming the servant of all, rather than dominating others. Power is discovered in submitting ourselves to others, and true love is attained in sacrificing ourselves in order to benefit others. The foremost symbol of this radical teaching is the cross. Jesus lived the cross-life in submission to all human beings. He was the servant of all. He flatly refused any position or honour. He lived the cross-life when He took a towel and washed the feet of His disciples. May we say no to a self-absorbed human existence and turn Fr. Michael from me, to you.
