Every gift is the best gift for her. She will hold the gift, dance in circles and then give you a big hug that makes you feel as if you gave her the world. She will show everyone her gift. Jesus wants us to welcome this joyful and enthusiastic spirit of children into our life. He wants us to enjoy all that He gives us without wanting more and more of power, domination and position. Children are full of trust, adoration and wonder. They do not allow the pressures and disappointments of life to affect their trust of others. They depend on adults and their parents for everything and do not want to be left alone. That is why God wants us to trust and depend on him rather than depending on our power and abilities. We have no reason not to trust God for He never fails. The Lord is always for us, not against us and we have nothing to fear or worry. No matter how disappointing a situation is, we should allow God to lead. Remember that life cannot be handled by human wisdom or capabilities, for we do not have absolute control over life. Consequently, being like a child is also about staying humble. The disciples had been arguing about who among them was the greatest. To correct them, Jesus lifted up a child in His arms as their model. A child does not think about his own greatness and power but the greatness and power of his parents, which therefore implies that if greatness and power in God's kingdom is our goal, God's own comes first and is the Centre of our own. Entrance Antiphon
