MARRIAGE IS NOT A BURDEN BUT A BLESSING

A wise priest once wrote these words: "When I was young I was a revolutionary. My prayer to God was: 'Lord, give me the energy to change the world.' As I approached middle-age and realised that my life was half-gone without my changing a single soul, I changed my prayer to: 'Lord, give me the grace to change all those who come into contact with me. Just my family and friends and I shall be satisfied.' Now that I am old and my days are numbered, I have begun to see how foolish I have been. My one prayer now is: 'Lord, give me the grace to change myself.' If I had prayed for this from the start, I would not have wasted my life.' This reminds us that the capacity to change others comes from the Holy Spirit; starts with ourselves and is rooted deeply in love. Every relationship is a gift from God and is meant to be cherished. This involves us learning that pointing fingers at others is an exercise in futility because it prevents us from pointing our fingers at the one person that we have a right to criticise – ourselves. As we see from the Gospel reading, Jesus was trying to show the Pharisees that they were wrong about marriage. It is not a burden but a blessing. Marriage is not man's work but God's. And what God joins together, man cannot separate. Only death can do that. And death is God's business, not man's. We live in an age of finger pointing, where people blame each other for breakdown of relationships and marriage. When things break down, nobody accepts the blame but rather point accusing fingers at the other, neglecting their own wrong doing, thereby losing the opportunity for growth and forgiveness. It is not God that breaks relationships, but our attitude of forgiveness and holding onto grudges that destroys relationships. Where there is true love and faith, there is nothing that love cannot forgive. Fr. Michael

TODAY'S READINGS

Entrance Antiphon

Cf. Est 4: 17

Within your will, O Lord, all things are established, and there is none that can resist your will. For you have made all things, the heaven and the earth, and all that is held within the circle of heaven; you are the Lord of all.

Gospel Mark 10:2-16

Some Pharisees approached Jesus and asked, 'Is it against the law for a man to divorce his wife?' They were testing him. He answered them, 'What did Moses command you?' 'Moses allowed us' they said 'to draw up a writ of dismissal and so to divorce.' Then Jesus said to them, 'It was because you were so unteachable that he wrote this commandment for you. But from the beginning of creation God made them male and female. This is why a man must leave father and mother, and the two become one body. They are no longer two, therefore, but one body. So then, what God has united, man must not divide.' Back in the house the disciples questioned him again about this, and he said to them, 'The man who divorces his wife and marries another is guilty of adultery against her. And if a woman divorces her husband and marries another she is guilty of adultery too.' People were bringing little children to him, for him to touch them. The disciples turned them away, but when Jesus saw this he was indignant and said to them, 'Let the little children come to me; do dom of God belongs.
