'What do you want me to do for you?' "Rabbi, I want to see.'"

Bartimaeus' physical blindness reminds us of the total blindness of the world where people that cannot see the power of God in their lives and the world around them. Ironically, it was only the physically blind Bartimaeus that could see Jesus and throw himself at his feet. The crowd tried to discourage and intimidate him because they cannot see Jesus as the God that he is. Imagine the persistent shout of the crowd; still, Bartimaeus was determined to see God. Don't let anyone hold you back; your worth is not tied to their opinion. The purpose of your creation is not fulfilled through them. Often, we miss the opportunity to be healed and helped by God because we give in to discouragements and negative feedback from others. Also, we seek help everywhere, but not from God because we cannot see the power of God. Many see only gloom and doom; they see only problems but they don't see the God of hope that is the solution to their problems. They do not see the light that towers over their darkness and depression. Many cannot see the beauty of the Saviour and the wonderful things that God is doing. When they manage to come to the Church, they cannot see the point of it all. Many do not see the good in others. Many cannot see the suffering of those around them and the need to encourage others. They have desensitised themselves to the pains and suffering of others. A person that sees as God will never behave in these ways. They will see the glory of God and they will see the image of God in whoever they meet, and in every occasion. They will not talk about or treat people badly because they can see God in them. Remember that it is only when we can see God and see like God that we can be healed. To see intensely is to love intensely like God. Fr. Michael.

And many of them scolded him and told him to keep quiet, but he only shouted all the louder, 'Son of David, have pity on me.' Jesus stopped and said, 'Call him here.' So they called the blind man. 'Courage,' they said 'get up; he is calling you.' So throwing off his cloak, he jumped up and went to Jesus. Then Jesus spoke, 'What do you want me to do for you?' 'Rabbuni,' the blind man said to him 'Master, let me see again.' Jesus said to him, 'Go; your faith has saved you.' And immediately his sight returned and he followed him along the road.
