## If we live without prayer, we die without hope

As a child, the first two prayers that my Mum taught me were the prayer before meals and my bedtime prayer. The bedtime prayer is this: "Now I lay me down to sleep. I pray thee, Lord, my soul to keep. If I should die before I wake, I pray thee, Lord, my soul to take." Reflecting on this prayer now, it sounds scary but profound at the same time. It acknowledges the uncertainty of life that death brings, but also the certainty of our connection to God. It acknowledges that we must be ready and appreciate life, but acknowledges that God is always with us, both in this life and in the next. Prayer can help us to be ready because in prayer, we truly understand the meaning of life and death. This helps us to be alert and not give in to complacency. When we live as if we will never die, we live empty, purposeless lives, and postpone things we must do. Moreover, prayer helps us to be alert at to the God that is with us. We become clear minded and ready, knowing that death is not an annihilation, but the becoming of one with God. This helps us not to be fearful, angry and stressed about death. It helps us to know how to handle death in order to live a hopeful life. Prayer helps us to love deeply, and forgive easily, for the uncertainty of death can make us cynical, selfish and uncaring. Prayer reminds us of how much we are loved by God and encourages us to draw from the font of that love. Though we feel deep pain at the death of loved ones, but love reminds us that there is no loss in love for love never dies. Prayer also helps us to understand that our life is a gift from God and that everything that happens to us is from God, to make us better, and not bitter. This helps us to stop moaning, but live our life in service to God and others. Finally, prayer reminds us that even in our darkest hour, the Lord never abandons us. His loving gaze is always upon us. He watches over us night and day. If we stay with God in prayer, no matter how dark life turns, we have nothing to fear. He is always with us until the end of the world.
