GOD'S WORD FOR EVANGELISATION

The written Word of God (the scriptures) is central in the evangelisation ministry. The first reading presents Ezra, solemnly reading to the Israelites, the Law of Moses, through which they rededicated themselves to God. In the gospel, Jesus started his ministry in the temple by reading from the scroll of Isaiah 61:1-2. Accordingly, in our catholic worship, the mass always starts with the readings followed by the liturgy of the eucharist. Finally, the Rites of Sacraments and Blessings all have a Word of God as a constitutive part. All these demonstrate the centrality of the scriptures in evangelisation.

While taking the reading, Jesus inaugurated a ministry to the marginalised that included the poor, the blind, the captives, and the oppressed (Lk 4:16-20). In this way, Jesus is showing a concern to all the different parts that form his body of believers. St. Paul, in the second reading, draws an analogy of the importance of each of the body parts that form a functional body (I Cor 12:12-30). Thus, Jesus is proclaiming a healing of each of the imperfect parts so as to finally have a functional whole body - the Church.

As Christians, we share in this ministry of being led and empowered by scripture to reach out to all God's people. How often do I read or listen to God's Word? How much and how often am I involved in activities meant for the marginalised; the poor, the elderly, the sick, those in prison, the widows and orphans, the travelers, the refugees, etc? How much of my resources have I contributed for the liberation and healing of these 'captives'? Let us all share in proclaiming boldly a year of God's favour through our words and deeds.
