BAPTISM OF THE LORD Our Christmas time comes to the end with the celebration of the Baptism of the Lord. The following day

we go to the Ordinary time. In our catechism classes we were taught how the sacrament of baptism washes away our original sin, makes us children of God and members of the Church. When we analyse these pertaining to Jesus Christ, we wonder why he went to John to be baptised. He was God, and already a son of God. Later, we realise that he was baptised to show solidarity with sinful humanity for their salvation. Thus, Jesus' baptism reminds us of our baptism and encourages us to renew it today. One preacher was recalling the big celebrations of his Christian faith in an African rural setup which included Easter, Christmas and the day of baptism. He noted that what was most common on each of them was the food of rice. This food can remind us of some of the vital elements of our baptism i.e. rebirth, initiation, consecration and empowerment. Rebirth; in baptism we are born-again to be children of God and consequently we are given a name that identifies us as such. Initiation; ushers us into the community of believers. Consecration; through the anointing of Chrism we are set apart for God and blessed. Empowerment gives us the power of the Holy Spirit to bear witness to Christ (Acts 1:8) and even bring other people into his kingdom (Mt 28:19-20). Let us reflect on whether we still uphold our dignity of being children of God, plus the value of our membership in the community of believers. The empowerment we received demands of us to increase the flock of Christ by bringing more believers through our preaching and a life of witness. This witness also includes showing a concern by reaching out and sharing our blessings with our needy brethren, particularly the elderly, the sick, the displaced, the grieving, and others. As we celebrate Jesus' baptism, let us awaken our baptism and re-enkindle it to shine to all humanity so that our Christian life might help people to glorify our heavenly Father (Mt 5:13-16).

TODAY'S READINGS

Entrance Antiphon

Cf. Mt 3: 16-17

After the Lord was baptized, the heavens were opened, and the Spirit descended upon him like a dove, and the voice of the Father thundered:

Comfort, comfort my people, says your God.
