The Parable of the Prodigal Father.

I prefer to call today's Gospel reading the parable of "The Prodigal Father." The word "prodigal" refers to extravagant or lavish. The centerpiece of Jesus' parable is the extravagant and lavish grace given by a father to his wayward son. The parable shows the lavish prodigality of God's grace. Jesus shows the father, a noble rich man running like a fool to welcome a son that has squandered his inheritance. He hugs and kisses him before he could even recite his repentance speech. Nothing! not even demanding simple contrition from him. He gives him the best clothes, calls a big party, kills the special fatted calf and instead of being ashamed of his son, rather, he calls people to celebrate his stupid son. There is so much to take in from this story and it reminded me of my parents, especially my Mum, as we celebrated Mother's Day. They demonstrated to us how much we were loved as children and that no matter what we do, there is always love waiting for us at home. They ensured that we knew that we were loved unconditionally at home. The son returned because he knew the prodigal love of his father. Hence, when our world is a mess and we cannot find our way, or when we suffer for our selfishness, we must turn back and return to God. His love for us will never waver. Whether we have left home for 5 minutes or 50 years, God's love is constantly waiting for us. God's love sees beyond our past, sins, guilt and shame. When God looks at us, He sees only his beautiful child. Dear God, as we reflect on what this father did with his younger son, we are once again astounded. The lavishness, prodigality, unwavering and unexpectedness of God's grace is overwhelming. Help us to enjoy your lavish grace and use it to transform our lives. Amen. Fr. Michael

For our sake he made him to be sin who knew no sin, so that in him we might become the righteousness of God.

Luke 15:1-3, 11-32

At that time: The tax collectors and sinners were all drawing near to hear Jesus. And the Pharisees and the scribes grumbled, saying, 'This man receives sinners and eats with them.' So he told them this parable: 'There was a man who had two sons. And the younger of them said to his father, "Father, give me the share of property that is coming to me." And he divided his property between them. Not many days later, the younger son gathered all he had and took a journey into a far country, and there he squandered his property in reckless living. And when he had spent everything, a severe famine arose in that country, and he began to be in need. So he went and hired himself out to one of the citizens of that country, who sent him into his fields to feed pigs. And he was longing to be fed with the pods that the pigs ate, and no one gave him anything. 'But when he came to himself, he said, "How many of my father's hired servants have more than enough bread, but I perish here with hunger! I will arise and go to my father, and I will say to him, 'Father, I have sinned against heaven and before you. I am no longer worthy to be called your son. Treat me as one of your hired servants.' And he arose and came to his father. But while he was still a long way off, his father saw him and felt compassion, and ran and embraced him and kissed him. And the son said to him, "Father, I have sinned against heaven and before you. I am no longer worthy to be called your son." But the father said to his servants, "Bring quickly the best robe, and put it on him, and put a ring on his hand, and shoes on his feet. And bring the fattened calf and kill it, and let us eat and celebrate. For this my son was dead, and is alive again; he was lost, and is found." And they began to celebrate.

'Now his older son was in the field, and as he came and drew near to the house, he heard music and dancing. And he called one of the servants and asked what these things meant. And he said to him, "Your brother has come, and your father has killed the fattened calf, because he has received him back safe and sound." But he was angry and refused to go in. His father came out and entreated him, but he answered his father, "Look, these many years I have served you, and I never disobeyed your command, yet you never gave me a young goat, that I might celebrate with my friends. But when this son of yours came, who has devoured your property with prostitutes, you killed the fattened calf for him!" And he said to him, "Son, you are always with me, and all that is mine is yours. It was fitting to celebrate and be glad, for this your brother was dead, and is alive; he was lost, and is found."
