Pope Francis Obituary

The saying "how we live is how we die" aptly describes the death of Pope Francis, a key detail of which reflects the love, hope and faith that he inspired. He inspired the world with his concern for the poor and the forgotten through his life and message. In his final will, he asked to be buried in a simple coffin and in an underground tomb, without ornamentation and with only "Franciscus" written on it. He advocated a Church of mercy and an inclusive Church that will be a refuge for all. His catchphrase was always "todos, todos, todos" meaning "everyone, everyone, everyone". The poor, rejected, prisoners and marginalised were welcomed as his guests more that the powerful. This made many of his critics denounce him as a heretic and accuse him of being too liberal. However, he continued to exhort leaders, clergy and every Christian to be people of mercy rather than excluding others. He continued to encourage dialogue and a listening Church. He was the first Pope to name himself after St. Francis of Assisi, the 13th century saint renowned for his love for the poor, and for turning his back on status and privilege. Other Popes normally visited significant places and cathedrals after their election but Pope Francis' first trip as Pope was to the Italian island of Lampedusa, a camp where migrants who have crossed the Mediterranean Sea were imprisoned and he declared himself as one of them, helping to highlight the basic issues of poverty, war and justice that are at the centre of this issue. There, he denounced "the globalisation of indifference and called for the reawakening of conscience from world leaders." He clearly notes that he wants a "poor church that is for the poor" and in his first major encyclical, "The Joy of the Gospel," he urges that "Money must serve, not rule!" Pope Francis will be remembered as an outsider that walked and worked together with others rather than telling them what to do. He was a simple servant leader and hence he has chosen that the only inscription that will be on his tomb will be "Franciscus." He has removed from his life, worldly power and status, and returning to the Father's house as a humble servant. Fr. Michael

again, 'Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, even so I am sending you.' And when he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, 'Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven them; if you withhold forgiveness from any, it is withheld.' Now Thomas, one of the Twelve, called the Twin, was not with them when Jesus came. So the other disciples told him, 'We have seen the Lord'. But he said to them, 'Unless I see in his hands the mark of the nails, and place my finger into the mark of the nails, and place my hand into his side, I will never believe.' Eight days later, his disciples were inside again, and Thomas was with them. Although the doors were locked, Jesus came and stood among them and said, 'Peace be with you.' Then he said to Thomas, 'Put your finger here, and see my hands; and put out your hand, and place it in my side. Do not disbelieve, but believe.' Thomas answered him, 'My Lord and my God!' Jesus said to him, 'Have you believed because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have believed.' Now Jesus did many other signs in the presence of the disciples, which are not written in this book; but these are written so that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that by believing you may have life in his name.

All: Praise to you Lord Jesus Christ.


