A New Commandment; Love one Another

A story was told about the ministry of Mother Theresa. Once a man watched Mother Theresa caring for a man with gangrene, and he said, "I wouldn't do that for a million pounds." Mother Theresa responded, "Neither would I. However, I do it out of love for God." Mother Theresa practically responded to Jesus' new commandment of love in today's gospel. After Judas had disappeared from the Last Supper, Jesus used the time to give his farewell message of a new commandment, "Love one another as I have loved you" (Jn 13:34-35). According to Jesus, the measure of love is to love even when there's no reward. He became the model since He gave up His life for all by crucifixion. The love of Jesus is such a radical and revolutionary love.

Jesus' commandment of love was first implemented by the apostles who went out to preach for the salvation of souls, not only of the Jews, but the Gentiles as well. Today's First Reading presents the end of St Paul's first missionary journey. In his parting message together with Barnabas, they encouraged believers to be united and persevere in the faith. They then chose some leaders to guide and strengthen the community in the ministry despite the persecutions. After the apostles and other subsequent saints, the risen Lord is calling upon us to observe this commandment in our time. It's such an important command, since it is the farewell message of the Lord. How am I living this command of love? How am I involved in programs geared towards the salvation of other peoples' souls and their well-being?


NEW ANNOUNCEMENTS

WHO ARE SPIRITAN MISSIONARIES?

The congregation of the Holy Spirit is one of the religious missionary Orders in the Catholic church e.g. Jesuits (SJ), Dominicans (OP), Augustinians (OSA), Benedictines, etc. It was formerly known as Holy Ghost Fathers whose members use the postnominals **CSSp** (meaning *Congregatio Sancti Spiritus*). It is composed of Brothers, Priests and Lay Associates. The Spiritans were founded on Pentecost Sunday, 27th May, 1703 in Paris, France by a young seminarian Claude Poullart des Places (1679-1709). He hailed from a noble family of Rennes in Northwest France and gave up his career as a lawyer to become a priest. He was touched by the poor life of city chimney sweeps and poor seminarians. He brought together those poor seminarians into a rented hostel and formed a community with a "one heart and soul" (*Cor Unum et Anima Una*) solidarity with a readiness to take on any work for which the church had difficulty in finding ministers. He supported these seminarians with the little donations from his family and friends. Soon the little community started expanding and people were attracted by their simple lifestyle and dedication. In 1707 Poullart himself was ordained but later developed pleurisy that led to his demise on 2nd October, 1709, at only thirty. However, the ministry continued growing until the upheaval of the French Revolution in the 18th century that almost stifled the congregation.

In 1848 another French founder Fr. Francis Mary Paul Libermann accepted to merge his society of Holy Heart of Mary with the Holy Ghost leading to "The Congregation of the Holy Spirit under the Protection of the Immaculate Heart of Mary" as the official title of the Order. With the new spirit, the congregation then took on new missions in Europe, America, Indian Ocean, Australia and Africa. Today, Spiritans numbering over 3000 members are carrying out the evangelization mission in more than 60 countries throughout the world.
