Heaven on Earth.

During an interview granted to one of the Nigerian billionaires, the journalist asked whether he could emphatically say that he was happy and at peace. He responded "Prior to this time, many had thought that I was a fulfilled man. However, being rich alone does not guarantee peace and happiness, unless it is used at the service of humanity." Further, he narrated an experience that explained his understanding of peace and happiness. He narrated how his bosom friend told him about 40 children from a particular poor village who were crippled and had no means of moving around freely. His friend pleaded with him if he could purchase 40 wheelchairs for these children. Immediately, he bought the wheelchairs and sent them to his friend. However, upon receiving the wheelchairs, his friend insisted that he joined in presenting the wheelchairs to the recipients. After the presentation, a little crippled girl, held his clothes so tightly and refused to let him go. When this little girl was asked why she did that, she responded by saying that she wanted to have the complete picture of the man's face so that when she arrived in heaven, she would be able to spot the man and tell God he was the one that made her smile while on earth. After narrating this experience, this rich man noted that his life changed and he felt a sense of satisfaction and peace. For him, riches, not used in the service of humanity were useless, and peace that is not about compassion, forgiveness and love, was incomplete. Jesus tells us in the Gospel, "If anyone loves me, he will keep my word, and my Father will love him, and we will come to him and make our home with him." For Jesus to make a home in us, our life should be about service to others and putting a smile on the faces of those we meet. Heaven is not only a place in the sky where go to when we die, but also where God lives in us. Heaven is when others look at us and see the face of God. Heaven is when people feel at home with us and when we feel at home with God who is love.

'It has seemed good to the Holy Spirit and to us to lay on you no greater burden than these requirements.' In those days: Some men came down from Judea and were teaching the brothers, will come to him. Alleluia. 'Unless you are circumcised according to the custom of Moses, you cannot be saved.' And after Paul and Barnabas had no small dissension and debate with them, Paul and Barnabas and some of the others were appointed to go up to Jerusalem to the Apostles and the elders about this question. Then it seemed good to the Apostles and the elders, with the whole Church, to choose men from among them and send them to Antioch with Paul and Barnabas. They sent Judas called Barsabbas, and Silas, leading men among the brothers and sisters, with the following letter: 'The brothers, both the Apostles and the elders, to the brothers and sisters who are of the Gentiles in Antioch and Syria and Cilicia, greetings. Since we have heard that some persons have gone out from us and troubled you with words, unsettling your minds, although we gave them no instructions, it has seemed good to us, having come to one accord, to choose men and send them to you with our beloved Barnabas and Paul, men who have risked their lives for the name of our Lord Jesus Christ. We have therefore sent Judas and Silas, who themselves will tell you the same things by word of mouth. For it has seemed good to the Holy Spirit and to us to lay on you no greater burden than these requirements: that you abstain from what has been sacrificed to idols, and from blood, and from what has been strangled, and from sexual immorality. If you keep yourselves from these, you will do well. Farewell.' Reader: The word of the Lord.
