A True Disciple Resembles the Master

During this Easter time, the Acts of the Apostles constantly narrates the experiences of the apostles and disciples after Jesus' Ascension. In many instances we have recognised what happened in the life of Jesus continued happening in their lives, such as: miracles, moving to different places to preach, and also persecutions. St. Stephen had an outstanding resemblance to his Master, especially in his sufferings. As the Lord was thrown out of the city for crucifixion (Jn 19:17), so also was Stephen (Act 7:58). During the persecution, Jesus forgave and prayed for those who crucified him (Lk 23:34) as Stephen also did (Act 7:60). Finally, they both surrendered themselves to God (Lk 23:46; Act 7:59). Thereafter, their victory has proclaimed the eternal life which has been acknowledged in every generation. These experiences have remained in the lives of believers from that time right up to the present day. This week on 3rd June, the Catholic Church will celebrate the glorious life and martyrdom of St. Charles Lwanga and his twenty-one companions - the Uganda Martyrs. They chose to serve the living God by accepting all the tortures from their King including burning them at the stake in the period between 1885-1887. Their martyrdom gave a strong foundation to the faith and has always attracted many pilgrims including Popes particularly Paul VI (1969), John Paul II (1993) and Francis (2015). As Tertullian wrote in his 2nd Century Apologeticus, "The blood of the martyrs is the seed of the Church", this has remained true from the time of Jesus, of St. Stephen and of many other Martyrs. We are the disciples of today and the risen Lord is calling upon us to bear witness to him (Acts 1:8) and participate in the growth of his kingdom. May the Holy Spirit endow us with fortitude to stand steadfast for our Lord and his Church. Fr. Bonaventure CSSp
