The harvest is rich

In Luke's gospel, unlike Matthew and Mark, there are two stories of Jesus sending out followers on their own. He first sent out the twelve (Lk 9) and later the seventy-two (Lk 10). Sending out more after the twelve is sometimes interpreted as an emphasis on the universal scope of Christ's message (to the whole world). We often identify the Twelve Apostles with the ordained ministers whom Jesus, at the Last Supper, commanded to do this in memory of him. Then, the seventy-two sent out today can be likened to the Laity. Consequently, Jesus' mission is for both the ordained and non-ordained followers. This second sending out is explained by the size of the harvest. The main task was to proclaim the Kingdom, which was an urgent concern. At the same time, Jesus warns them against rejection in some places, and so the gesture of shaking off the dust at their feet when leaving such places was born. Such rejection doesn't pertain to them personally, as it's a rejection of Jesus himself.

There are still many people today who have not heard the Word of God and their lives would change tremendously if it were preached to them. They need someone to reach out to them. What does Jesus ask of me today? First, to pray that the Lord sends out more labourers to his vineyard (Lk 10:2) and second, my active involvement since he sends me as well (Lk 10:3). Thus, every Christian is called upon to participate in this mission. Have I offered Mass intensions and personal prayers for the missions? How often have I gone out to share God's Word, to visit and pray for the sick, to visit the elderly, and to instruct/teach the young the Faith? Have I accepted any leadership or voluntary roles in my church? Let us never forget to pray for the missions, participate in evangelisation works, and encourage more people to accept to be sent out into the Lord's vineyard. Fr. Bonaventure, CSSp.

And he said to them, 'The harvest is plentiful, but the labourers are few. Therefore pray earnestly to the Lord of the harvest to send out labourers into his harvest. Go your way; behold, I am sending you out as lambs in the midst of wolves. Carry no money bag, no knapsack, no sandals, and greet no one on the road. Whatever house you enter, first say, "Peace be to this house!" And if a son of peace is there, your peace will rest upon him. But if not, it will return to you. And remain in the same house, eating and drinking what they provide, for the labourer deserves his wages. Do not go from house to house. Whenever you enter a town and they receive you, eat what is set before you. Heal the sick in it and say to them, "The kingdom of God has come near to you." But whenever you enter a town and they do not receive you, go into its streets and say, "Even the dust of your town that clings to our feet we wipe off against you. Nevertheless know this, that the kingdom of God has come near." I tell you, it will be more bearable on that day for Sodom than for that town.'

The seventy-two returned with joy, saying, 'Lord, even the demons are subject to us in your name!' And he said to them, 'I saw Satan fall like lightning from heaven. WANT TO BE A LAY SPIRITAN? WHO ARE SPIRITANS?

The Congregation of the Holy Spirit (The Spiritans) is a Roman Catholic Order of Priests, Brothers and Lay Associates. It was founded in 1703 by a young French seminarian – Claude Poullart des Places who gave up the legal profession to become a priest. He founded a community of young men who felt called to priestly and religious life dedicated to the Holy Spirit. In the 18th century another French man - Francis Libermann - who had started a Congregation of the Immaculate Heart of Mary merged it to that of the Spiritans. These two Orders that were dedicated to the evangelization and liberation of the poor then became The Congregation of the Holy Spirit under the protection of the Immaculate Heart of Mary.

WHO ARE LAY SPIRITAN ASSOCIATES?

Together with the Priests and Brothers, lay Christians can join the Spiritan Congregation as Lay Spiritan Associates. They participate in the evangelization ministry by sharing in the spirituality and participating in the mission activities of the congregation.
