When prayer is strongest, mercy and love are nearest.

A priest was walking down the street when he heard a young man swearing and using God's name in vain. Approaching the man, he touched the man on the arm and said, "Can you pray as well as you can swear?" The young man laughed and, with a superior air, declared that he never indulged in anything so useless as praying. Holding up a coin of considerable worth, the priest said, "I will give you this coin if you promise me never to pray." Irreverently, the young man grabbed the coin, thrust it in his pocket and went off laughing. As the day wore on, however, he began to feel uneasy. Never to pray? Never? Perhaps he had made a bad bargain, for he might want to call upon God someday if he should come to an urgent need. The more he thought of it, the more he became convinced that he had given up something very precious. He arrived home that evening and told his wife of the transaction and she was horrified. "It is true we don't pray?" she said, "but someday we may want to." We take prayer for granted but we cannot do without prayer. The person who prays to God can stand up to anything in the world. However, prayer is not about extracting favours from God. It is about knowing God and entering into a relationship with him. In Abraham's prayer, you can see a form of fondness and familiarity that is seen only in true friends who are comfortable with each other. They are like two lovers. We cannot pray well if we do not experience God as love, for in prayer, God's mercy receives and accepts us as we are, hence, when prayer is strongest, mercy and love are nearest. Also, in prayer, God reveals to us how precious we are to him and the many wonderful qualities that we have. He helps us to understand how precious we are and valued by God. Furthermore, in prayer, God helps us to know that everyone is connected. What affects others affects us too. Abraham did not pray for himself or take delight in the punishment coming for others because he realised that those in Sodom and Gomorra are still his brothers and sisters. Remember, the measure of our love for others is determined by our prayers for them. Fr. Michael

Abraham answered and said, 'Behold, I have undertaken to speak to the Lord, I who am but dust and ashes. Suppose five of the fifty righteous are lacking. Will you destroy the whole city for lack of five?' And he said, 'I will not destroy it if I find forty-five there.' Again he spoke to him and said, 'Suppose forty are found there.' He answered, 'For the sake of forty I will not do it.' Then he said, 'Oh let not the Lord be angry, and I will speak. Suppose thirty are found there.' He answered, 'I will not do it, if I find thirty there.' He said, 'Behold, I have undertaken to speak to the Lord. Suppose twenty are found there.' He answered, 'For the sake of twenty I will not destroy it.' Then he said, 'Oh let

not the Lord be angry, and I will speak again but this once. Suppose ten are found there.' He answered, 'For the sake of ten I will not destroy it.'
