Everything is futile except God

Today's first reading comes from *Ooheleth* (Ecclesiastes), written during a time of economic prosperity in Israel. Trade in agricultural products, livestock, gold, pearls, and even slaves, was booming. Yet, amid this wealth, many people grew complacent—so absorbed in their material success, that they turned away from God. The Gospel reading complements this message with the parable of the rich fool. When Jesus uses the word *fool*, He refers to someone who lives without God. We meet a man who works tirelessly and is blessed with an abundant harvest—a gift clearly made possible by God. However, instead of gratitude or generosity, his focus is entirely on himself: "I, me, my, myself, and mine." He plans a future of comfort and ease, forgetting the One who holds the future and even his own soul: "You fool! This very night your life will be demanded from you" (Luke 12:20).

This message remains strikingly relevant. We live in a generation defined more by individualism than by community, more by consumption than by compassion. The second reading reminds us of our fraternity as creatures made in God's image. We are called to see God in others and to serve Him by serving them. Sadly, greed, envy, hatred, and jealousy continue to block true fraternity and community life.

Can we reclaim the spirit of the early Christian community described in Acts 2:42–47 and 4:32–37—sharing freely, living simply, and worshipping joyfully? There are only a few things truly eternal and worth investing in: God, His Word, and His people. Let us not be blinded by the fleeting riches of this world, but turn instead to what truly matters. As Ecclesiastes reminds us: "Vanity of vanities, all is vanity" (Eccl 1:2). Only in God can we find meaning that lasts. Fr. Bonaventure, CSSp

Brothers and Sisters: If you have been raised with Christ, seek the things that are above, where Christ is, seated at the right hand of God. Set your minds on things that are above, not on things that are on earth. For you have died, and your life is hidden with Christ in God. When Christ who is your life appears, then you also will appear with him in glory. Put to death, therefore, what is earthly in you: sexual immorality, impurity, passion, evil desire, and covetousness, which is idolatry. Do not lie to one another, seeing that you have put off the old self with its practices and have put on the new self, which is being renewed in knowledge after the image of its creator. Here there is not Greek and Jew, circumcised and uncircumcised, barbarian, Scythian, slave, free; but Christ is all, and in all.
