The Man Who Changed His Life After Reading His Obituary

The creation of the Nobel Prizes by Alfred Nobel began with an extraordinary event — his accidental reading of his own obituary. Nobel, the inventor of dynamite, had amassed great wealth from his discovery. However, when one of his brothers died, a French newspaper mistakenly believed it was Alfred and published his obituary under the headline: "The Merchant of Death is Dead." The article condemned him, calling him an "angel of death" and "the wealthiest vagabond in Europe," who had become rich by killing and mutilating the innocent. Nobel was devastated to realise that this was how the world would remember him. This prompted a profound re-evaluation of his life's purpose. Determined to change his legacy, he used his fortune to establish the Nobel Prizes — awards to encourage peace, development, and cooperation.

Reflecting on our own obituary can help us prepare for death by inspiring us to live purposefully. It reminds us of the true meaning of life and to be ready to answer God's call of love and service. No eulogy ever celebrates the number of cars, houses, or designer clothes we own. Instead, people speak of how we loved, served, inspired, and cared for others.

It is not the richest or most powerful who are mourned the most, but the most loving and kind. Our readiness to meet God depends on how much we have loved, how generously we have served, and how willing we have been to share our lives. Time is not measured by the ticking of the clock, but by how much of it we devote to others. It is our most precious gift, and our supply is not limitless. Let us not waste it chasing shadows and frivolities. Instead, use it to know, love, and serve God and others. This is the surest way to be ready for Christ — and to have a truly good obituary.
