You must be narrow-minded.

When someone calls us narrow-minded", it is considered an insult. For this invokes images of rigidity and inability to listen to others. However, in the Gospel reading this Sunday, Jesus tells us to be people of the narrow road when someone in the crowd asked him "Lord, are only a few going to be saved?" Noticeably, Jesus does not directly answer his question but tells him to enter through the narrow gate. What does this narrow gate mean for us? Narrowminded means to be biased and not to consider other people's idea or opinion. However, narrowminded is not a flaw in the Bible but the way of the life of a faithful Christian that leads to abundance in God. Correctly, Jesus wants us to be narrowminded in terms of our salvation by focusing on God and nothing else. We must be biased for God over everything and trust him in every situation. This means that in our life that it is only God that matters and our role model. He is the source of our life and love. Also, he is the total object of our love and adoration. We should not focus on other people because everyone is on a journey towards God or compare ourselves to others. Comparison can make us feel that we are better, thereby turning us proud and condescending to others. Also, it can make us feel worse than others, thereby making us depressed, discouraged and distrustfully of God's grace. We should not focus on ourselves, because we can be weighed down by our weaknesses or overestimate ourselves, forgetting therefore that our salvation is about the power of God. When we focus on God and keep him first, everything else will be taken care of. Remember, when we focus on giants, we stumble but when we focus on God, Giants tumble. Fr. Michael.
