Solidarity with the Poor

Today's Gospel teaching from the two parables draws our attention to humility and solidarity with the poor and the most abandoned members of our society. On the surface, the parable of a wedding feast (Lk 14:7-11) seems to present table etiquette in choosing seats at a party. However, seen from the eyes of the early church whose assembly was the feast of the Eucharist, we recognize that it is more than table etiquette. The Eucharistic feast transforms all people into brothers and sisters before God. St James wrote about how considerations at assemblies were being done for the rich but none for the poor (James 2:2-4) yet, all of them pray together saying "Our Father". Jesus is calling upon followers to abolish the rich-poor distinction among them. This is because those who exalt themselves will be humbled and those who humble themselves will be exalted (Lk 14:11). The second parable is addressed to Christians concerning the people they invite to the feast of the Lord's supper. Jesus calls for preference to the weak and poor members. Just as we shouldn't invite people with expectations of them inviting us in turn, we ought thus to invite the poor just because they are brethren.

If Jesus is calling Christians to champion solidarity with everyone, how good is the treatment of the poor and people with challenging needs in our church community? The Wednesday Warm-welcome in our parish is an initiative in this respect. Am I in any way involved in that initiative? For instance, by contribution, sharing a moment with the participants, doing the serving and others? How am I assisting the elderly, the blind, visitors, and the deaf during our liturgical celebrations? This is the meaning of the Lukan text, "invite the poor, the crippled, the lame, and the blind" (Lk 14:13).

One Sabbath, when Jesus went to dine at the house of a ruler of the Pharisees, they were watching him carefully.

Now he told a parable to those who were invited, when he noticed how they chose the places of honour, saying to them, 'When you are invited by someone to a wedding feast, do not sit down in a place of honour, lest someone more distinguished than you be invited by him, and he who invited you both will come and say to you, "Give your place to this person", and then you, with shame, will take the lowest place. But when you are invited, go and sit in the lowest place, so that when your host comes he may say to you, "Friend, move up higher." Then you will be honoured in the presence of all who sit at table with you. For everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, and he who humbles himself will be exalted.'

He said also to the man who had invited him, 'When you give a dinner or a banquet, do not invite your friends, or your brothers and sisters or your relatives or rich neighbours, lest they also invite you in return and you be repaid. But when you give a feast, invite the poor, the crippled, the lame, the blind, and you will be blessed, because they cannot repay you. For you will be repaid at the resurrection of the just.'
