The Holy Cross: Healing Through Reconciliation

St Helena, mother of Emperor Constantine, is remembered for her pilgrimage to the Holy Land in search of the cross on which Jesus was crucified. With the help of St. Macarius, Bishop of Jerusalem, she discovered it in 326 AD. To distinguish the true cross from the others found, a miraculous healing took place when the authentic cross was placed upon a sick woman on 3rd May of that year. Soon after, Emperor Constantine built the Church of the Holy Sepulchre, which was dedicated on 14th September, 335 AD. Historically, crucifixion was regarded as a shameful punishment reserved for criminals and rebels. Yet Jesus transformed the cross into an instrument of healing and salvation. This power of healing had been foreshadowed in the Old Testament, when those bitten by serpents were healed simply by looking upon the bronze serpent Moses lifted up in the wilderness (Num 21:4–9). Christ's saving work is the ultimate act of reconciliation. By his incarnation, he took on our humanity; by his death on the cross, he restored what Adam had lost. Through his sacrifice at Calvary (Phil 2:6–11), heaven and earth were reconnected.

This crucifixion reconciled not only humanity with God, but also people with one another as seen in the contrite conversion of the repentant thief (Lk 23:42–43). In this way, the cross has both a vertical dimension reconciling humanity with God and a horizontal dimension reconciling human beings with one another. It is the triumph of love over hate, life over death, and faith over despair.

Pope Francis reminds us that the cross is the sign of God's infinite love for each of us and the source of our salvation. For this reason, there is no shame in identifying with the cross whether by wearing it or in signing oneself as a believer in Jesus Christ. Rather, it is a proud symbol of healing, reconciliation, and victory. Am I joyfully wearing my cross?

TODAY'S READINGS

Entrance Antiphon

Cf. Gal 6: 14

We should glory in the Cross of our Lord Jesus Christ, in whom is our salvation, life and resurrection, through whom we are saved and delivered.

First reading Numbers 21:4b-9

In those days: The people became impatient on the way. And the people spoke against God and against Moses, 'Why have you brought us up out of Egypt to die in the wilderness? For there is no food and no water, and we loathe this worthless food.' Then the Lord sent fiery serpents among the people, and they bit the people, so that many people of Israel died. And the people came to Moses and said, 'We have sinned, for we have spoken against the Lord and against you. Pray to the Lord, that he take away the serpents from us.' So Moses prayed for the people. And the Lord said to Moses, 'Make a fiery serpent and set it on a pole, and everyone who is bitten, when he sees it, shall live.' So Moses made a bronze serpent and set it on a pole. And if a serpent bit anyone, he would look at the bronze serpent and live.

Give ear, my people, to my teaching;

incline your ear to the words of my mouth. I will open my mouth in a parable and utter hidden lessons of the past. **R**

When he slew them, then they sought him, repented and earnestly sought God. They would remember that God was their rock, God the Most High their redeemer. **R**

Yet they deceived him with their mouths; they lied to him with their tongues. For their hearts were not steadfast towards him; they were not faithful to his covenant. **R**

Christ Jesus, though he was in the form of God, did not count equality with God a thing to be grasped, but emptied himself, by taking the form of a servant, being born in the likeness of men. And being found in human form, he humbled himself by becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross. Therefore God has highly exalted him and bestowed on him the name that is above every name, so that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.
