Disposition for Prayer

The readings of last Sunday, and today, are focused on the theme of prayer. Whereas last Sunday the emphasis was on praying without ceasing, today we look at our disposition and attitude during prayer. The Gospel story of a Pharisee and a tax collector, contrasts spiritual pride and humility during prayer. Who were the Pharisees? They were disciplined and devout believers. They fasted twice a week (on Monday and Thursday), and gave tithes from all their income. Therefore when the pharisee said, "I am not like the others: thieves, rogues, adulterers..." (Lk 18:11-12), he was stating facts. This Pharisee is self-righteous about his 'holiness' and he boastfully tells God that he is not a sinner like the tax-collector. On the other hand, tax collectors were people of low moral standards. As they worked with the Roman rulers, they always handled their unclean money and ended up in a state of "ritual uncleanliness." They were also known for collecting additional money from the people and always used the surplus for their own benefit. In this way, they ended up being categorised as thieves. Today's tax-collector is humble, acknowledging that he is a sinner and stands at a distance and seeks God's mercy. Whenever we come into God's presence to pray, we ought to humbly acknowledge our unworthiness before our creator (Ex 3:5-6). We should acknowledge our sinfulness and entrust ourselves to the generous mercy of God, instead of praising ourselves. This is what the church does at the beginning of Mass. It is also vital to be concerned about our personal relationship with God, and only pray for our neighbour, instead of informing God of their sins. Finally, am I doing God a favour by my deeds that I have to enumerate them for Him to take note? Bonaventure, CSSp.


