What Kind of a Messiah Are You Waiting For?

A story is told of a man who asked God to visit him. He thoroughly prepared everything at his home for such a great visitor. As he eagerly waited for God on the appointed day, he was surprised to keep seeing beggars, specially gifted individuals, elderly people, refugees and others knocking at his door. He kept chasing them away because he was waiting for an important guest who, unfortunately, never turned up! In his dream that night, God told him that he struggled to visit him but all the time he kept chasing him away! What kind of a Messiah am I waiting for on Christmas day? Actually, most Jews expected the Messiah to be a fully-grown person who would drop suddenly from the skies and land on the Temple Mount. This is probably why, in the temptation narrative, Satan proposed to Jesus that he jump from the pinnacle of the Temple (Mt 4:5-7). Today's Gospel narrates that the Messiah was conceived just like us and spent nine months in the womb. The mother, Mary, was an ordinary country girl. While here on earth, Jesus remained a common person in infancy, adolescence and adulthood up to thirty years of age. His name is Emmanuel (Isa 7:14; Mt 1:23), meaning God-with-us. Just like the Jews, are we still only waiting for a miraculous Messiah? How many have left the church wandering all over looking for miracles? Have we prepared for Christmas by reaching out to Jesus among our poor neighbors, the sick, the elderly, the hungry, the displaced/refugees and those in prisons? What plans do I have concerning sharing my Christmas with the suffering Jesus? Let us serve him through our brothers & sisters since they are all created in the image and likeness of God.

Gospel Acclamation Matthew 1:23

Alleluia, alleluia. Behold, the virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and they shall call his name Emmanuel — which means, God with us. **Alleluia.**

Gospel Matthew 1:18-24

Now the birth of Jesus Christ took place in this way. When his mother Mary had been betrothed to Joseph, before they came together she was found to be with child from the Holy Spirit. And her husband Joseph, being a just man and unwilling to put her to shame, resolved to send her away quietly. But as he considered these things, behold, an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream, saying, 'Joseph, son of David, do not fear to take Mary as your wife, for that which is conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit. She will bear a son, and you shall call his name Jesus, for he will save his people from their sins.' All this took place to fulfil what the Lord had spoken by the prophet: 'Behold, the virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and they shall call his name Emmanuel' — which means, God with us. When Joseph woke from sleep, he did as the angel of the Lord commanded him: he took his wife.

Priest: The Gospel of the Lord.

All: Praise to you Lord Jesus Christ.

THE NICENE CREED:

I believe in one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church. I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen
